

Douglas Boy Scout District Has New Field Executive

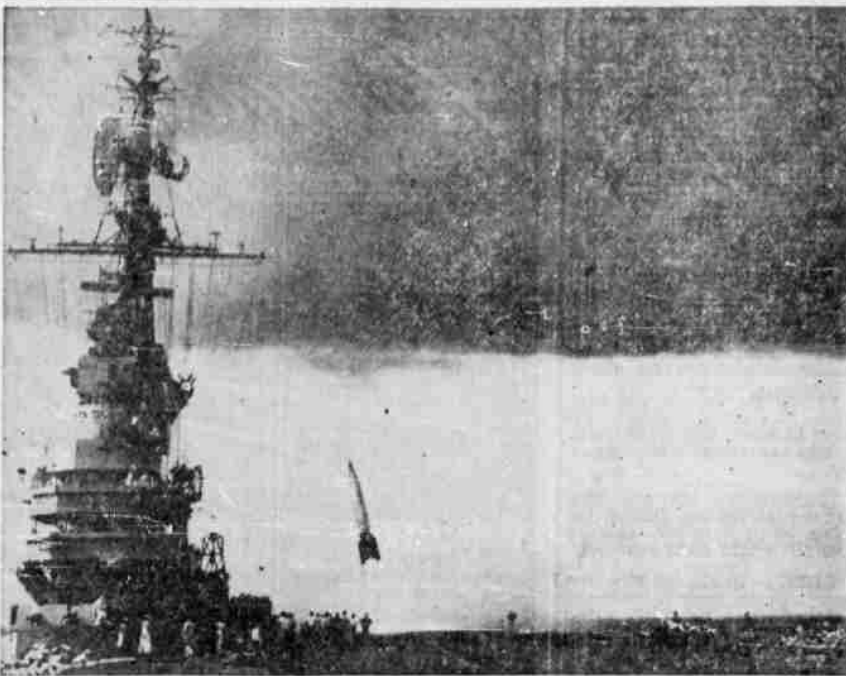

Roger Bales, scout executive of the council, indicated that Mr. Yivisaker is well qualified for the position he has been selected to fill. The past four years he has served as assistant executive of the Crater Lake Council with headquarters in Medford. He came to scouting from the field of education. In 1943 he taught at the Southern Oregon College at Ashland where he specialized in instrumental music and orchestra. Following graduation from the Lutheran College in Iowa, he taught in public schools until entering the professional service of scouting in early 1944.

ROCKET LAUNCHING MARKS NEW ERA IN NAVAL WEAPONS



Marking "the beginning of a new era in Naval weapons," the United States Navy fired a captured German V-2 rocket from the flight deck of the 45,000 ton aircraft carrier USS Midway on September 6, 1947. This was the first time in history such a bombardment rocket has been launched from ships or a moving platform. The primary purpose of the experiment, held at sea several hundred miles off the East Coast of the United States, was to ascertain if large bombardment rockets could be fired off modern aircraft carriers without modifications affecting flight operations. 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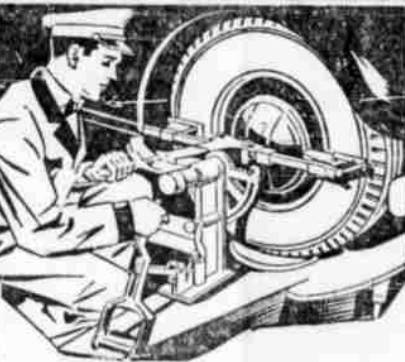
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High School Carnival Scheduled at Yoncalla
