## Girl Assaulted After Fiend Murders Escort

DRACUT, Mass., Oct. 20.—(AP)—Fighting in defense of his girl friend, a 32-year-old Lowell construction worker was slain early today by a gunman who then

kidnaped the girl and, police said, raped her repeatedly during a wild four-hour automobile ride. Detective James F. Coniff of the state police identified the slain man as Edward Pare and said he had been "stabbed or shot in the back—or possibly both." A short time after the girl reported the attack, Detective Coniff said another Lowell man hunted for questioning attempted suicide by shooting himself in nearby Lexington. Coniff identified the man as Russell Davis, 23, an army air corps veteran. His condition was not critical.
