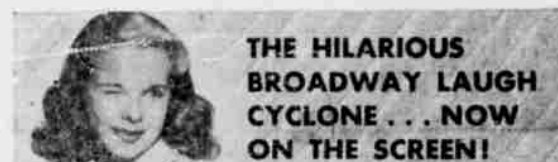

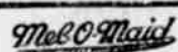

## Tanker Explodes After Collision; Two men Die

MONTEREY, Calif., Oct. 24.—(AP)—Two crew men were believed to have perished early today in fires and explosions aboard the Richfield Oil Company's tanker Sparrows Point following a mid-night collision with the Canadian motorship Manx Fisher.

Eight hours after the accident, which occurred 15 miles off Point Sur on the California coast in a heavy fog, the Coast Guard said fire fighters appeared to be getting the fire under control.

Thirty-five crew members escaped from the tanker in life boats and were picked up.

## Britain Must Cut Down Expenditure, Cripps Warns

LONDON, Oct. 23.—(AP)—Sir Stafford Cripps, minister of economic affairs, served notice today that Britain immediately must cut expenditures on housing, factory construction and new capital machinery by \$800,000,000 a year to help ease a deepening economic crisis.

Sir Stafford declared the labor government expects to balance its overseas accounts by the end of 1948.

## Ex-Member Tells Of Reds' Activity In Los Angeles

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24.—(AP)—Oliver Carlson, former communist, told the House Un-American Activities committee today that communists have sought control of the public schools of Los Angeles.

The Los Angeles local chapter of the American Federation of Teachers "has been dominated by communists," Carlson said. Many teachers, he added, have refused to join the union because of its communist leaning and have complained to the parent union.

Carlson related that a recent school board election in the city brought out 24,543 votes for an unsuccessful communist candidate. While but a small percentage of the total vote, he said, it indicates the strength of the party.

Carlson branched off into the discussion of communists and the public schools while testifying at the committee's hearings on communist activities in the movie industry.

He said communist leaders have worked for years to extend the party's influence in Hollywood.

Carlson told newsmen he left the communist party many years ago and had joined it "when I was a kid." He identified himself as now a writer and a teacher in the extension service of the University of California.

Carlson was called to the witness chair after Mrs. Lela Rogers of Hollywood had testified that communist activities in the movie capital are increasing but "I feel we have held them in check by exposing them."

Mrs. Rogers said communists have obtained control of "many schools" and have injected their propaganda into many places, "even the little women's clubs."

She cited the picture "None but the Lonely Heart" as a "splendid example" of communist propaganda in the movies.

The picture was handled "in the Russian manner," Mrs. Rogers said.

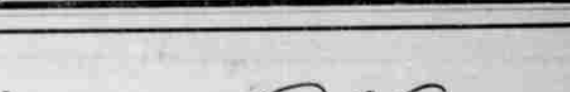

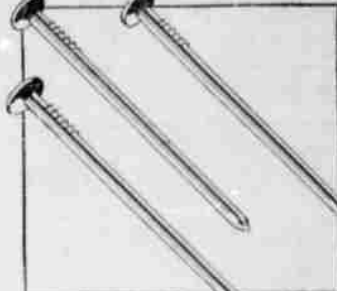

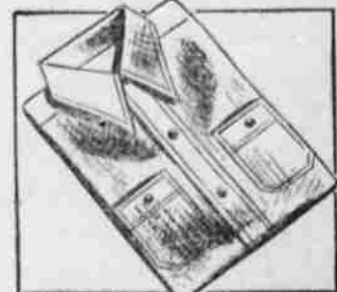
