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National Radio Week Observed at Chamber Forum

The "Man on the Street" who usually broadcasts from a Jackson St. sidewalk every day, moved his microphone into the Civic Room of the Umpqua Hotel yesterday noon during the Chamber of Commerce forum luncheon, to present a program in observance of National Radio Week.

Staff members of KRRR were introduced to the audience and "live" broadcasts of the regular state and regional news, national and international news, and daily market quotations were presented. Then, Del "Man on the Street" McKay interviewed Chamber of Commerce members on his regular, informal program.

Mrs. Iris Helliwell, station manager, told of the advances made by commercial radio stations since the close of the recent war and of problems faced by the radio industry.

Staff members who attended the luncheon included Leroy Hiatt, chief engineer; Carol Kerr, receptionist and publicity director; Laura Joyce Patton, continuity writer; Del McKay, commercial manager; Al Gordon, program director and news editor; Ralph Smith and Bill Noethens, announcer-engineers, and Frank Roberts, announcer. Not able to attend were Announcers Lyle Fenner and Max Dick, and Jesse Cutting, traffic manager.

Mrs. Helliwell said the titles "sounded impressive," but everyone "doubled from announcing to sweeping down the stairs." She expressed regret that she could not also introduce Ed Knapp, business manager of the News-Review, who is "the man who signs the paychecks." Pamphlets containing market data of the Roseburg area, used in contacting national advertisers, were distributed to the forum audience.
