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Grain Prices Up, Hogs are Lower

Grains and cotton prices edged higher on the country's commodity exchanges today, but hogs drifted generally lower at major midwest markets.

With the cost of most basic foods at or near record peaks, the National Confectioners' Association reported, meanwhile, that the upward price trend was the industry's greatest problem.

Since Jan. 1, 1941, prices of confectionery raw materials have risen 72 to 83 per cent and "are still on the increase," the association said, adding: "These increases . . . throw a light of uncertainty on the future of many types of confections."

The government announced last night that 33,639,000 bushels of grain had been allocated for export in December, compared with 29,514,000 in November. Hogs were steady to 25 cents a hundred pounds lower in Chicago and 25 to 50 cents lower in St. Louis.

At the opening of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, eggs for future delivery moved irregularly and butter went higher a fraction of a cent.
