Good Luck, Truman Tells Marshall

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—(AP)—President Truman personally wished "God speed and good luck" to Secretary Marshall yesterday upon the Secretary of State's departure by air for the Big Four foreign minister meeting in London.

"I know you are going to have it because you know how to do your job," Mr. Truman said. "I have the utmost confidence in you."

The president spoke into a microphone at the National Airport where Marshall took off in the "Sacred Cow"—the four-engined plane which Mr. Truman has used so often.

At the meeting in London starting next week, the Big Four—the U. S., Britain, France and Russia—once again will try to reach agreements looking toward a European peace settlement.
