## Soil Conservation Positions Opened To Examinations

Examinations leading to permanent positions with the Soil Conservation Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture in Oregon and three other Pacific Northwestern states, were announced today by M. C. Doyle, secretary for the Civil Service Commission in Washington.

The positions would be those of soil conservationist, soil scientist, agricultural and civil engineers, at salaries ranging from \$3,397 to \$4,179. Duties would include analysis of land and water problems on farms and ranches, preparation of farm plans, classification and mapping of soils, the survey, design and construction of engineering structures used for water control, irrigation and drainage.

Examinations were also announced for permanent probationary appointment to the positions of painter, painter's helper, carpenter, electrician's helper, and general mechanic's helper in the Roseburg Veterans Hospital. Entrance salaries for these positions range from \$2,020 to \$2,694.96 per year. Applicants will be graded on the basis of their experience and training. No written test is required, said Doyle.

Further information about any of these positions may be obtained from any first or second class post office, or from the Eleventh Civil Service Region, Room 4, Central Building, Seattle 4, Wash.

## 3-Mile-Rule for Offshore Fishing Held Outmoded

SEATTLE, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Edward W. Allen of Seattle, a member of the International Sockeye Salmon Commission, expressed the belief today that the historic "three-mile rule" for national control of offshore fisheries is outmoded under present conditions.

In a paper prepared for the Inter-American Bar Association meeting in Lima, Peru, Allen advocated prompt action to protect fisheries not already controlled by laws or treaties, without regard to what he described as obsolete doctrines.

The "three-mile rule" prescribes national controls over fisheries only to that distance. He cited measures taken by joint Canada-United States commissions to rebuild halibut and sockeye runs as a commendable international precedent.

He suggested that one set of rules might have to be adopted to cover sea rovers such as whales and tuna and another for such fish as salmon and halibut. He described the whales and tuna as comparable to bears and deer on land, "but localized fisheries such as salmon and halibut may well be considered analogous to domestic herds of sheep and cattle," subject to control by neighborhood nations.

## Legislation Will Seek Cut in Home Building Cost

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Chairman Gurnea R. N. Y. of the House Labor subcommittee investigating the building trades says the group soon will suggest legislation which members expect will cut the cost of private home building by as much as one-third.

"Undoubtedly a large part of the present high cost of home construction is attributable to 'featherbedding' and slowdowns by organized labor," Gurnea said. "It is these practices that must be stopped if the little man, the man with the low or medium income, ever is to be in a position to build a home for himself and his family."
