Jorge Bolet, Noted Pianist, Heard in Splendid Concert

Jorge Bolet held only the rank of lieutenant in the U. S. Army during World War II, but he is a four-star general when it comes to being a concert pianist. This was the opinion of members of the Roseburg Community Concert Association at the Junior High School auditorium Saturday evening.

The famed pianist, who is the winner of the coveted Naumburg Award; who presented his debut recital at Town Hall and followed by playing three very successful New York concerts at Carnegie Hall, enthralled his audience with the brilliance of his playing. He showed a complete mastery of the art and his listeners were most enthusiastic in their applause. At the close of the concert, he played three encores.

Members of other Community Concert Associations throughout the state can note that Jorge Bolet is truly an outstanding genius and that his concert alone is well worth the price of the entire membership for the year. Without question, his perform-

ance here was one of the very best offered by Columbia Concerts Inc. of New York.

From the opening numbers "Capriccio, Opus 118, No. 1" and "Capriccio, Opus 118, No. 7" by Brahms to the closing number, "Mephisto Waltz" by Liszt, the program was skillfully and beautifully presented. "Sonata in E flat major, Opus 81A (Les Adieux)" by Beethoven was followed with the numbers "Impromptu, No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3" and "Fantaisie-Improvisation" by Chopin.

Numbers following the intermission were Ballet Music from "Rosemund" by Schubert; "Moment Musical" by Schubert; "Waltz in D flat (Minuet)" by Chopin; "Masques" by Debussy; "Study in the Style of a Waltz" by Chopin.
