Babe Fenton Meets Fries Tonight in Salem Headliner

"Babe" Fenton, Roseburg featherweight, will meet Hal Fries, Salem battler who claims the Oregon state featherweight championship, in the 10-round main event of Promoter "Tex" Salkeld's fight show at the Salem Armory tonight.

Both youngsters are rated as the state's heaviest punchers in their weight division. Fries, a left hander, has disposed of eight of his last opponents via the knockout route.

Fenton's best weapon is a straight right hand punch, and if he can park his right glove on the Salem boy's chin, he should return to Roseburg a winner.

A bout between boxers who both have exceptional hitting ability usually results in a knockout and, regardless of who wins, the bout will probably end before the scheduled 10 rounds are completed.

A six round semi-final and three four-round preliminaries complete the show.

Walcott On Trail To Sizable Cash

NEW YORK, Dec. 10.—(AP)—Jersey Joe Walcott stands to make a pretty penny from exhibitions, personal appearances, radio and writing jobs between now and the time he meets Heavyweight Champion Joe Louis in a return bout, probably next June.

Walcott's manager, Joe Webster, said today that the Camden, N. J., fighter already had received offers totalling \$150,000, and is considering making a South American exhibition tour similar to the junket Louis took last winter.

Walcott, loser of a disputed split decision to Louis in their 15-round title bout here last Friday night, has indicated the Twentieth Century Sporting Club management will have to do some dickering to get him into the ring again with Louis.

Louis said yesterday he would be willing to meet Walcott again on a 40-20 per cent cut of the gross gate. But Webster, announced in Philadelphia that his fighter wants 30 per cent "and not a point less."

Marjorie Zeller Returns With Scholarship Award

Marjorie Zeller of Brockway, winner of many 4-H club awards, returned home from Chicago Tuesday with a \$200 college scholarship, which she earned at the National 4-H Club Congress.

Her scholarship award was made by the Montgomery Ward and Co., since she was one of six national record contest winners in the annual homemaking competition.

Marjorie was awarded the two-week trip to Chicago by being the state 4-H winner in "girls records," awarded on the basis of achievements in the last seven years, in which she completed 52 club projects and led 12 4-H clubs.

Last year, Marjorie was one of Oregon's four delegates to the National 4-H Club Camp in Washington, D.C.

Graduating as a senior from Roseburg High School in the spring of 1947, Marjorie is undecided as yet about the college she plans to attend.
