Sports Events In Douglas County In 1947 Reviewed

After a successful year of sports 1947 fades into the past, leaving its record of achievement and the host of contributions to the welfare of sports events to join the files of sports history.

The new year stalks into the endless procession with the promise of at least as many strides in the promotion of sports activities during the next twelve months.

This sports summary reviews the major events of the old year.

Basketball — Roseburg High tied with St. Mary's of Eugene for second place; both teams lost to the champions of Eugene High School, Roseburg Junior High's Papooses won exactly half and won half of their games. The Rainbow Grill semi-pro team won 19, lost 7; Sutherland won the Douglas County Northern Division championship. Fullerton triumphed over the other three grade schools.

Baseball—Roseburg High lost the regional championship to Klamath Falls by a 2 to 1 defeat. The Umpqua Chiefs placed second in the Shaughnessy cup playoff, fourth in league games. Grants Pass won both contests. Boxing—Roseburg High contestants out-fought boxers from Klamath Falls and Springfield high schools.

Track—A new school record for the 440 was set at Roseburg by Ed Harvey; time 51.3; Art Backlund ran the mile in 4:33 to place seventh in the state; Art will be with Roseburg in this year's track season.

Football—Roseburg High won 4, lost 3; Coos Bay took the championship; The Roseburg Junior High team was not scored against; one scoreless tie was played with Grants Pass.

Wrestling — Promoter Elton Owen's matches have been a weekly success at the Armory.

Miscellaneous—A new gymnasium has been started at Roseburg High School. The High School gym floor has received a new design.

The gymnasium at Rose Grade School was converted last summer back into a gym, after serving for a time as classrooms. The floor of Edgewood School played has been polished and treated to make playing easier.

The Benson playshed is being made into heated basketball rooms. The Roseburg Benchwarmers donated more than \$300 worth of equipment and uniforms to the four Grade Schools. Tumbling classes have been held at Fullerton School.

Plan for Current Year

Douglas County athletic enthusiasts look forward among other things to the following added color in the 1948 sports picture. At their annual meeting in late February or March, the Benchwarmers plan to show sound movies of the '47 world series. The northern and Southern Divisions of the Douglas County Independent Basketball League will combine into one league. The J.V. Sporting Goods store will combine with the Rainbow Grill to compose the J.V.-R. team.

The Umpqua Chiefs basketball team will get new floodlights in the near future. New facilities for boxing workouts are being erected under the grandstand at Senior High School. Miniature auto racing at the Armory is making its bid for recognition; there is also a hot rumor that midget racers will add Roseburg to their circuit.

The Roseburg roller skaters hope to form a skating club some time during the year. Edgewood's basketball team will be coached by Charlie Taylor, Senior High player.

The Benchwarmers will begin an enrollment program this month.

Another B-29 Missing in Alaska; Nine Men Aboard

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Jan. 2.—An Army harbor vessel criss-crossed waters of Cook inlet near here today as part of an expanding search for an air force B-29 supersonic bomber which vanished Wednesday a few minutes after taking off from Elmendorf field with nine crewmen aboard.

A bright flash seen in the plane's line of flight just after it left on a weather observation mission led searchers to fear it exploded and fell into Cook inlet.

Meantime there was no word from the search for five men missing after the crash of an another B-29 north of Nome Dec. 23. Missing are the pilot and navigator of the plane, unreported since they set out afloat to seek aid, and three members of a medical team who parachuted in rescue efforts. Six crew members of the crashed plane were rescued.

Fire at Reedsport Destroys Large Quantity of Meat

REEDSPORT—A fire which destroyed the Water Front Lockers here late Tuesday night, with close to a \$50,000 loss, spread after a piece of meat bearing a considerable amount of fat had fallen into the smokehouse fire, said Elmer Samson, acting fire chief.

The fire was discovered by F. L. Taylor, operator of the establishment, who had gone into the processing room to care for the meat. As he attempted to extinguish the burning piece of meat that had fallen into the fire, the flames spread into the building.

Taylor ran upstairs to warn his wife and friends who were visiting, and to rouse his two sleeping children from their beds. The fire closed in so rapidly, that Mrs. Taylor was unable to descend the stairway and was rescued from an upstairs window.

All available fire fighting equipment was rushed to the scene, including the city's two regular trucks, the emergency truck, and the Tug Boat "Juno," which is equipped with a powerball nozzle. Samson, assistant fire chief, took charge in the absence of Chief Kelly.

The locker plant contained more than 500 individual lockers all heavily loaded with food. Many of the lockers were rented to Smith River farmers, who stored meat and poultry there. Several Reedsport residents kept their kill of deer and wild elk in the lockers.

While salvage crews are attempting to save as much as possible of the meat, it is estimated that the loss will be close to \$50,000.

Kenneth Wise, Reedsport, was arrested and fined for driving an automobile over a fire hose during the fire.

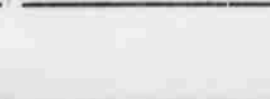
