

Crash of Trains Kills Fourteen in Missouri

The other identified dead included Pullman conductor F. E. Emmons, St. Charles, Mo.; Pullman porter Harry Chamber, Lovejoy, Ill. and Roy Ryan, Sr., Evansville, Ind.

Four of the dead had not been identified positively but Missouri State Highway Patrolman E. K. Johnson said personal effects had been found for the following:

Harriet Thompson, St. Louis, daughter of Dr. John P. Murphy, Katy railroad physician.

Viola Anderson, Richmond, Va., the Weddell's maid.

Miss Jane Radatz, San Fernando, Calif.

Cpl. Everett P. Gilpin of Gerhart, en route from Green Haven, N. Y., to Camp Crook, Calif.

Removal of the bodies was hampered by sub freezing temperatures. Traffic on the tracks was expected to be resumed today.

The Missouri Pacific issued a statement saying there probably was "flagrant negligence on the part of certain train employees." Earlier Col. High Waggoner of the State Highway Patrol attributed the collision to an apparent failure of block signals. The Missouri Pacific statement said the signals were in perfect order.

SEDALIA, Mo., Jan. 2. (AP)—Missouri Highway patrolmen today combed through the tragic debris of death-battered baggage and wrecks that told of gay holiday trips—seeking further identification of passengers killed in the Missouri Pacific train wreck 20 miles east of here.

Many of the women had jewelry and party dresses and broken pocketbooks testified to the force of the terrific jolt when the locomotive on one train rammed the rear car on another.

A ribbon of tooth paste was squeezed from one kit, in another, a broken box of pills was crushed into a tin mass.

Some of the watches were in ruins. Others were undamaged. A shiny gold pocket watch, identified as that of former Ambassador W. Weddell, seemed in perfect condition. Weddell's Phi Beta Kappa key still dangled on the chain.

rupted and in some communities paralyzed. Sheet and freezing rain covering electric wires cut off telephone and light service. Street cars in many cities were halted and radios were silenced due to mechanical difficulties and wrecked towers.

Scores of communities in several states were isolated from telephone communication as the icy gales snapped lines. Highways in many midwest areas were impassable. Trains and buses operated far behind schedule and all airline flights in and out of Chicago and other midwest cities were canceled.

The strong winds—gusts reached as high as 60 miles an hour in some parts of the storm belt—wrecked radio towers in Chicago and broke store windows and uprooted trees in many communi-

ties. Nine transmitter towers toppled and three others were damaged in and near Chicago. Mechanical difficulties interrupted broadcasts on many of the major stations.

The winds stirred up Lakes Michigan and Erie and the Coast Guard at Milwaukee said waves were 30 feet high. High water on Lake Erie forced 50 families to evacuate from the resort area along the north shore of the Detroit area. In Chicago the south section of Lake Shore Drive along Lake Michigan was closed after waves flooded the heavily traveled highway.

Highway crews took the arduous task of clearing Washington and Oregon highways today after coastal regions of the Northwest states were lashed yesterday by a high wind that reached a peak of 65 miles an hour at Tatosh Island and 58 miles an hour at Astoria, Ore.

The blasts brought a deluge of rain that turned to snow in the mountain regions, halted shipping and ferry services at the mouth of the Columbia river, disrupted power service throughout Western Oregon and left highways clogged with felled trees.

Wind reached peaks of 35 miles an hour at La Grande and Klamath Falls, Ore., 30 miles an hour at Walla Walla and 20 in Spokane.

Gumshoe Method Used

The Honolulu Star-Bulletin quotes Judge Wimberly as reporting he will hold no formal public hearings, but has invited interviews from individuals desiring to present their views. When not occupied with interviews, Wimberly told representatives of Honolulu's leading newspaper, he plans to "gumshoe around." He told reporters he recognizes Hawaii as "the outstanding example in the world of racial mixing—living and working together in harmony." He said he will investigate the extent of the mixing, but added that the senate is interested in race, religion and party politics only to the extent that they may have a direct bearing on the government here and on statehood for the future.

Wimberly expects to remain in Honolulu for a few days after Senator Cordon arrives, and will fly back to the mainland about the middle of the month, according to present plans.
