## R. W. Shaw Named Agent For Steel Building Firm

Rupert H. Shaw, former Eugene housing expediter, has been appointed sales representative for Coos and Douglas Counties for the Eugene Steel Building Co., with headquarters in Coos Bay.

The company has been given the exclusive agency for Southern Oregon for the Quonset-type of building made famous during the recent war by the armed forces. Modifications of the building make it suitable for commercial and industrial uses.

Several businesses in Douglas County are housed in Quonset

huts, the company pointed out, including the theater at Drain, the A. R. Dotson myrtlewood novelty factory at Coos Junction, and a manual training shop at Roseburg Junior High School.
