New Buildings At Reedsport Noted

REEDSPORT—Reedsport progress will be further marked by the completion of two new cement buildings early this year.

The newly-established Umpqua National Bank, which has been in the past the First National Bank of Gardiner, will move into its new location in a 50 by 90-foot cement structure on the corner of 5th St. and Fir Ave., adjoining the new Diehl building, another 50 by 90-foot cement building.

A sawmill recently incorporated as the Reedsport Lumber Co. is under construction and nearing completion on the Scholfield River. This mill will employ about 50 men.

Six new cement cabins have recently been completed at the Fir Grove auto camp and will soon be ready for occupancy.

More than 100 cottages will be erected just west of the city to house workers of the Gardiner Lumber Co.
