Bailey Bridges Arrive For S. Umpqua Service

Bailey bridges loaned by the Army were delivered today at the site of the Dillard bridge on the South Umpqua River, where they will be put in place for use while the main highway span is being repaired. The temporary bridge approaches, being erected by Ben Doerksen, Roseburg contractor, are not yet completed. The Bailey bridge spans, made of standardized steel parts, are expected to be lifted into place "within a few days."

The Bailey bridge sections were brought here in two large truckloads from Ft. Lewis by the Kenneth Poorman and Co. of Portland.

Approximately 25 tank trucks pass over the road daily, operating between Portland and coast points as far south as Bandon. Nearly all truck freight between Portland and Coos and Curry county districts passes over the Drain-Reedsport highway, it was claimed. The great amount of existing traffic, plus anticipated future increase necessitates immediate improvement of the Drain-Reedsport route, it was claimed, and it therefore becomes economically sound to connect the Dodge Canyon route and thereby channel commercial traffic from inland sections of the Umpqua Basin into Reedsport.

Other communities in Douglas County are to be invited to join in endorsing the report to be submitted at the Coquille meeting, County Judge D. N. Busenbark said.
