FAMED VIOLINIST TO BE HEARD JAN. 23RD

Joseph Fuchs, all-American trained violinist, who has gained renown throughout the Americas and Europe, will be presented in concert by the Roseburg Community Concert Association at the Junior High School auditorium the evening of January 23rd at eight-fifteen o'clock.

Fuchs was born in New York City and received his musical training in this country. At an early age, he won the coveted Morris Loeb prize and sailed for Europe to further his studies, but upon his arrival there he was besieged to present concert tours throughout Germany and Austria. Critics have highly acclaimed Fuchs as one of the finest violinists of this country.

He has played with some of the most outstanding symphony orchestras as well as being guest artist with a number and presenting numerous recitals, prior to turning to the concert stage entirely.
