

Expiration Of Driver Licenses In January Cited

Thirty-three thousand more driver's licenses will expire this month, motorists are reminded by Secretary of State Newbury.

All licenses bearing the serial numbers 5R231001 to 5R264000 become void on January 31. Any license numbered below 5R231001 is past due for renewal.

Under Oregon's new license renewal system, now in its eighth month of operation, driver's permits expire in blocks of 33,000 each month in accordance with the serial number on the face of each card. Printed schedules issued by the Secretary of State list the correct renewal dates.

These may be obtained from Sheriff's offices, police stations, or from driver's license clerks and examiners.

The procedure was adopted to offset the yearly rush of renewals under the old system and resulting strain on driver's license division personnel.

Being stressed is the fact that notices are mailed when licenses expire.

"Every driver must obtain a renewal schedule and check it carefully," Newbury emphasized. "Then it's simply a matter of applying for renewal at the proper time."

No advantage is gained by delaying until after the proper time, a license spokesman explained. The license issued will expire at the same time as if taken out during the correct month.

"Ike" May Forfeit G. O. P. Support

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—(AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower may risk any chance for the ultimate backing of regular Republican organizations in several states if he fails to stamp out the independent presidential draft movement, now under way.

The Army chief of staff has said several times that he has no interest in politics. But thus far he has not otherwise repudiated moves by the Draft Eisenhower league to put delegates into a number of GOP primaries.

While this move has the backing in New Hampshire or Senator Charles Tobey, Eisenhower enthusiasts elsewhere seem likely to be drawn from persons outside of and often at odds with the regular GOP organizations in the states concerned.

Some Pennsylvania politicians say the regular organization, which in the past has controlled the state's 73 convention votes, feels less kindly toward Eisenhower than if he had put his foot down on the independent movement.

The independents contend, however, that the general had small chance of getting this support in any event. They note that if a delegate slate pledged to him is elected, there will be no argument over where the state's vote will go.

INCUBATOR INSTALLED

Proposed Alaska Statehood Topic Of Controversy

PORTLAND, (AP)—Alaskan development hinges on clarification of Indian land title claims and improvement of the Alcan and other highways and marine shipping problems, spokesmen for the territory told a Western States Conference Council here.

A suggestion that only the more populous southeast portion of the territory be admitted to statehood came from Ralph Loman, Nome, chairman of the Alaskan delegation of Chamber of Commerce officials.

Loman asserted the 50,000 whites in the North could not support the expense of adequate state government. His statement came as Mayor Carl Velvestad of Petersburg, Alaska, urged the Western Chambers of Commerce to support statehood. Loman said a state could be created from the area south of the Yukon river and west of the 132nd Meridian.

Other Alaska speakers blamed the Indians for retarding industrial development along the heavily timbered region of the inland passage shores. R. E. Robertson, Juneau attorney, said the Indian claims, resulting from an Interior Department relief, had prevented at least eight pulp mills being established.

The council voted to seek legislation that would end the power of the Secretary of Interior to create or expand Indian reservations in Alaska.

Maintenance of the Alcan highway and the Haines cutoff by U. S. and Canada was urged as vital to development of the North's resources.

7,000 Coal Miners Of Canada Strike In Wage Dispute

VANCOUVER, B. C., Jan. 15.—(AP)—Seven thousand miners were idle today in British Columbia and Alberta, with workers walking off the jobs in an "unauthorized" strike after wage negotiations collapsed.

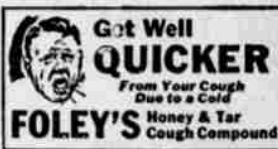
Vancouver Island and mainland mines, employing 3,000 workers, were closed, and more than 4,000 were idle in Alberta coalfields. In both provinces the walk outs were declared "illegal" by government officials as provisions of labor codes, with conciliation machinery, had not been complied with.

The men are members of the United Mine Workers of America District 18, and seek a \$14-a-day basic wage for miners working at the coal face and a \$3-a-day increase for other miners.

Union officials said the strike was unauthorized, but refused further comment.
