

Red Cross Aid To Veterans Related

Edwin D. Rounds, Red Cross assistant regional director, disclosed last night at the regular meeting of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, that 1182 veterans were aided by the Red Cross in Douglas County in 1947. Financial assistance was advanced to 341 veterans, either in the form of loans or of grants. This aid represented an amount of \$7,090. Rounds said that the Red Cross expects to expend approximately \$1,000 for relief purposes in Douglas County to compensate for flood damages. This money will go for such items as food and essential furniture which was destroyed.

The problem of furnishing financial aid to people traveling without sufficient funds was also brought up at the meeting. When

asked why financial assistance had been refused a certain family unable to complete a journey, Rounds said that Red Cross services are exclusively for the benefit of veterans, "barring disaster" by virtue of the congressional charter drawn up in 1905.

It was announced that the 1948 quota for Douglas County is \$12,000. Seventy-five per cent of the intake remains in the Douglas County chapter; the remaining 25 per cent goes to a central fund.

Miss Sutherland's major subjects at the university are sculpturing and ceramics.

National Forest Timber for Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 P. M., January 30, 1948, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting, and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 325 acres within Sections 28 and 32, T. 32, S. R. 3 W., W.M., Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 5,800,000 feet B.M. more or less Douglas-fir, 1,000,000 feet B.M. more or less sugar pine, 80,000 feet B.M. more or less California incense-cedar, 30,000 feet B.M. more or less western hemlock, 90,000 feet B.M. more or less white fir, and 30,000 feet B.M. more or less of ponderosa pine and other species of sawtimber. Sealed bids accompanied by required payment received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 P. M., January 30, 1948, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted

for information of all bidders. No bid of less than \$9.95 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$21.45 per M feet for sugar pine, \$14.35 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$4.35 per M feet for white fir and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage a cooperative deposit of \$0.40 per M feet B.M., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, a cooperative deposit of \$0.65 per M feet

B.M., to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$10,000 must accompany each sealed bid and must be shown to be in the possession of oral bidders as a qualification for auction bidding. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder

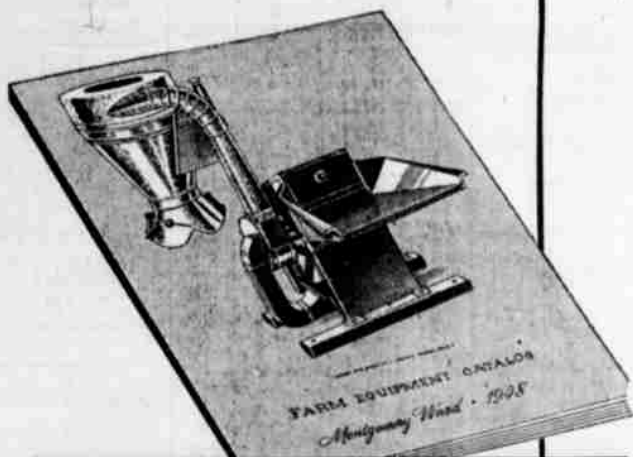
must immediately make the required payment and confirm the bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Tillamook, Oregon.
