

## Turkey Feather Gowns Will Be Shown in Films

Two hundred thousand dollars worth of technicolor film was used by Paramount Studio photographers, James Shaffelford and John Gunning, to record an "Unusual Occupations" film short featuring Mrs. Fred Ehrhart's collection of 250 all-weather gowns, hats, handbags and accessories fashioned from the feathers of turkeys and the brilliant plumage of birds from China, Guadalupe, and the Hawaiian Islands.

Mr. and Mrs. Ehrhart, the latter the former Barbara Orr, have returned to their home at Sutherlin, after being called to California to aid in putting finishing touches on the film which features the couple's wedding, Dec. 6, at the Far West Turkey Show banquet in Turlock, Calif. Turkey feather gowns made by Mrs. Ehrhart were worn by all female members of the bridal party.

Mrs. Ehrhart has spent many years in her unusual occupation and hobby, the subject of the film, which, she was told, will be shown to an estimated 200,000,000 theater goers in all parts of the world during the ensuing three years. The picture was made in technicolor throughout.

In addition to views of the wedding, the film depicts an evening devoted to a fashion showing of Mrs. Ehrhart's collection, with 30 models participating.

Fox Movietone newsreel photographers spent two days filming the making of bridal gowns, and Life Magazine photographers covered the entire collection and took pictures of the wedding as a special feature to be published in the near future.

## Turkeys On Par With Chickens In Oregon Total

Oregon's farm raised poultry products account for about one-tenth of the total cash receipts from the sale of all farm products, with turkeys and turkey eggs now ranking close to chickens and their eggs in importance.

This and much other information on Oregon's poultry industry is shown in a statistical publication, "Oregon's Farm Raised Poultry Products, 1909-1947," just issued by the O. S. C. extension service as extension bulletin No. 678, now available at all county offices.

Receipts for ducks and geese and miscellaneous poultry are relatively small in the total which exceeded \$40,000,000 at the peak in 1945. Income that year was nearly four times the 1935-1939 prewar average, the bulletin shows.

A sharp expansion of the poultry industry in Oregon occurred from 1943 to 1945, both in numbers produced and in value. This increase in value was due to higher prices as well as to the larger volume. From 1924 to 1942 the number of chickens on farms did not fluctuate greatly. The wartime demand, however, caused an upward trend for a few years, but since the war the scarcity and high cost of feed and other economic factors have resulted in a decline. Turkey numbers reached a peak in 1945 but have since dropped sharply.

In 1945, the Willamette valley accounted for 59 per cent of the chickens on hand at the beginning of the year and 70 per cent of the turkeys raised. In that year, Lane county led the state in number of chickens, while Marion county led in number of turkeys raised.

Other leading poultry counties in western Oregon are Clackamas, Marion, Washington, Linn and Douglas in chickens, and Clackamas, Lane, Yamhill, Linn and Douglas in turkeys. In eastern Oregon Malheur, Umatilla and Klamath led in chickens, and Deschutes and Umatilla in turkeys. Washington county is found to produce the greatest number of ducks, while Linn county leads in geese production.

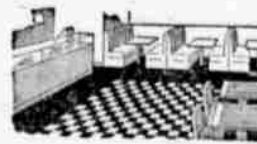
