## FAMED VIOLINIST TO BE HEARD FRIDAY

Joseph Fuchs, one of the top-ranking violinists in the country today, will be presented by the Community Concert Association at eight-fifteen o'clock Friday night at the Junior High School auditorium. Valentin Pavlovsky will act as accompanist.

Recently Joseph Fuchs acquired the "Cello" Stradivarius, also known as the "Cannon" because of its powerful tone. The instrument is dated 1722 and is a particularly fine example of the Cremona master's art. Joseph Fuchs first gained recognition as an especially talented violinist at the age of six. At the age of 17, he won the Isaac Newton Seligman prize of one thousand dollars and left for Europe to study with the German masters. Upon his arrival there, he was asked to present concerts and did so in both Germany and Austria, where he was acclaimed by the critics. Today Fuchs is pointed out as one of the few outstanding musicians in this country who have been exclusively American trained.

### SOUR CREAM APPLE TORTE

by *Martha Meade*

Two more cream apple tarts in flaky pastry belong to old world enchantment to your table.

*Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients.*

Place in a Suetpan —  
3 cups thinly sliced peeled apples  
2 tablespoons butter  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup granulated sugar

Cover and cook slowly, stirring occasionally, until apples are tender, about 15 minutes. Then stir in —  
1 cup sour cream  
1/2 cup whole egg, beaten (2 large)

Continue cooking slowly, uncovered, until mixture thickens, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and —  
1 tablespoon vanilla extract  
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind

Fill into pastry lined casserole and sprinkle lightly with nutmeg. Bake in a preheated hot oven, about 425°, for 20 minutes. To serve, cut into squares and garnish with sweetened whipped cream, if desired. Serve warm or cold. 6 servings.

\*Note: Either your pastry or table cream may be used. Sweet cream may be used by placing 1 tablespoon cream into the cup measure then allow it to drain. Let the mixture stand 15 minutes before using.

**PASTRY**  
1/2 cup shortening  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3 tablespoons cold water

Blend ingredients together with a fork until shortening is creamy and absorbs part of water. Then add all at once —

Stir, with circular motion, until pastry holds its shape. Turn out on lightly floured board, pressing quickly into a smooth ball. Roll pastry into an oblong, about 10 x 12 inches.
