Miss Ilse Dorothea Raacke of Curitiba, Brazil, exchange student at Oregon State College on a \$1000 Pan-American scholarship provided by the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs, will be guest of honor at a silver tea benefiting the scholarship and fellowship loan, Saturday, January 31, from two-thirty to five-thirty o'clock at the H. C. Berg home in Laurewood with the Roseburg Women's Club, assisted by the Junior Women's Club, as hostesses. Mrs. E. L. Tauscher is general chairman. Both men and women are cordially invited to the affair.

Mrs. William Chandice, state president, has been invited to attend as well as other state officers and state chairman. The district president, Mrs. May Kelly of Albany and the Corvallis president, Mrs. Mark McCallister, The state radio chairman, Mrs. J. L. Gault, Corvallis, will also be present.

Selection of Miss Raacke by Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs was on recommendation of the Institute of International Education. She was an outstanding graduate of the Institute de Quimica do Parana in Curitiba, Brazil, where she received her degree in chemical technique. Following her graduation last February, she worked in a state laboratory at Rio and previously had done some teaching in technical schools.

She is enrolled in the graduate school and is working toward her master's degree in physical or organic chemistry. Her fellowship is for a year, after which she will have to return to Brazil to complete studies for her doctor's degree in chemistry. The 22-year-old attractive Brazilian woman could easily be taken for another of the hundreds of native Oregonians on the campus for she has no particular language difficulties, especially when engaged in informal conversation. But she admits, occasionally she has a little trouble in some classes when the enunciation of her professors is not too clear. As for her own use of English, she could make some freshmen blush.
