Salmon, Trout Angling Rules On Umpqua River Set Forth; Ban on Spawned Steelhead

Angling regulations affecting the Umpqua River, as finally adopted by the Oregon Game Commission at its hearing in Portland Jan. 23, make three principal changes from the 1947 rules.

Salmon fishing during the month of August will be open below the highway bridge at Reedsport, instead of being closed entirely during that month as in 1947.

The 8-inch trout law will apply to the main Umpqua below The Forks, and to all tributaries entering the tidewater area, or below Scottsburg.

South Umpqua anglers will be permitted to fish for salmon and steelhead below Coffee Pot Side Camp from May 1 to May 31, approximately 15 miles above the previous winter deadline at Jackson Creek.

Trout season will open May 1 and continue through October 31, on all streams tributary to the Umpqua river above the head of tidewater. The general bag limit of trout not less than six inches will apply. The six-inch trout rule concerns the North and South Umpqua rivers and all tributaries to the main river, except those entering below the head of tidewater at Scottsburg. In the tidewater area and in the main river legal size limit is eight inches.

Spawners Protected
The summer steelhead season is from May 1 through October 31, and the winter season from Nov. 1 to March 1. Steelhead fishing is prohibited during the months of March and April, the chief spawning period, to protect spawners returning to salt water. The winter steelhead deadline on the North Umpqua has been raised from The Narrows at Idley to above the mouth of Rock Creek. Elk and Calapooia creeks are closed to winter steelhead fishing east of Highway 98, but open west of the highway.

The spring salmon season, fish not less than 20 inches, opens Jan. 1 and continues through May 31; the bag limit, one per day but not to exceed two in any seven consecutive days, nor more than 20 during the entire season. The summer season, "tidewater" only, below the highway bridge at Reedsport, is from June 1 through August 31, with a bag limit of 2 fish a day, not to exceed four in any seven consecutive days and not more than 20 during the entire year. The fall season is from

Sept. 1 through Dec. 31, with the same open area as for winter steelhead and with the bag limit the same as on summer salmon. The annual limit of 20 fish more than 20 inches is in the aggregate.

All waters are closed to steelhead fishing from March 1 through April 30, and all waters above the highway bridge at Reedsport are closed to salmon fishing June 1 through August 31. Sturgeon fishing is prohibited at all times and in all waters.

Bag limits of salmon and steelhead over 20 inches must be counted in the aggregate.

Open season for jack salmon, under 20 inches, corresponds to open seasons and areas for salmon over 20 inches with a bag limit of four in a day, but not to exceed eight in any seven days, or in possession, nor more than 20 during the entire year. The annual limit of 20 applied to jack salmon is not in the aggregate with salmon or steelhead of more than 20 inches.

Suez Canal Protection Move Started by Britain

LONDON, Jan. 27.—(AP)—Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin has begun talks with Arab leaders on Middle East problems, including what British government sources said is a program for an anti-Communist security system in the Arab world.

They forecast that American and British military strategy eventually would be involved.

The informants expressed belief that Bevin's fear of Soviet ambitions in the Middle East would supersede Jewish-Arab problems in Palestine.

They said Bevin is trying to set up a bulwark against the effects on the Suez Canal of a possible guerrilla victory in Greece, and an British-American supremacy in the Mediterranean.

The sources said the move was part of a plan evolved by the British foreign office and the American State Department.

Bag Limit On Fish Expected To be Assailed

**Conservation Move in
Two States Applies to
Salmon and Steelhead**

A conservation move, aimed at protection of salmon and steelhead, by imposition of an annual bag limit of not more than 20 fish more than 20 inches in length, is expected to arouse much protest from "meat" fishermen. The new regulation, patterned in part after a rule introduced in the State of Washington this year, is included in the angling regulations adopted by the Oregon Game Commission at its hearing in Portland last week.

Angling licenses purchased in 1949 are expected to include a means of accounting for the year's catch of salmon and steelhead. The 1948 regulations, limiting the total catch to 20 fish, will be difficult of enforcement, coming into effect with the inclusion of "tags," with the year's license.

The Washington State fish and game commission issued its angling license with a "pullman ticket" style of attachment, containing 20 designated spots which may be punched out with a pencil or stick. One of these holes must be punched as each salmon or steelhead is taken and the date of the catch must be recorded on the license.

The Oregon Commission is expected to use the same type of license in 1949, but for the current year will endeavor to enforce the annual limit without the use of a special license.

Special License Proposed

Salmon and steelhead fishermen may still find another change in 1949. A proposal is gaining impetus among sports groups for a special-salmon license. A fisherman could obtain a license to fish trout at the regular \$3 fee. But if he also planned to fish for salmon and steelhead—big fish—he would pay an extra \$2 and would receive his 20-limit card.

The money obtained from this special license would go into the game commission's fish propagation fund to be used for stream improvement, hatcheries, law enforcement and other work connected with conserving, propagating and protecting fish life.

The annual 20-fish limit for salmon and steelhead was adopted by both the Oregon and Washington commissions for protection against anglers reportedly commercializing the resource. Cannery Check Planned

A rapidly growing group of anglers, it is reported, have been fishing coastal streams. Their catch is packed at sportsmen's canneries and may be shipped to any address. There is now no way by which a check can be made to ascertain whether the fish so taken is retained by the angler for his own use or is sold. Records have been obtained, it was stated, showing that one angler, spending the summer at the mouth of the Rogue river, shipped more than 100 cases of salmon to his home address in California.

It is anticipated that legislation will be sought at the next session of the legislature for some form of regulation over sports canneries, permitting a closer check on the number of fish

brought in by individual anglers, thus giving a greater measure of enforcement over the 20-fish bag limit.

The bag limit of salmon and steelhead will be in the aggregate, thus making it unlawful to take more than 20 fish of either or both species combined during any one year, the restriction being only on fish more than 20 inches in length.

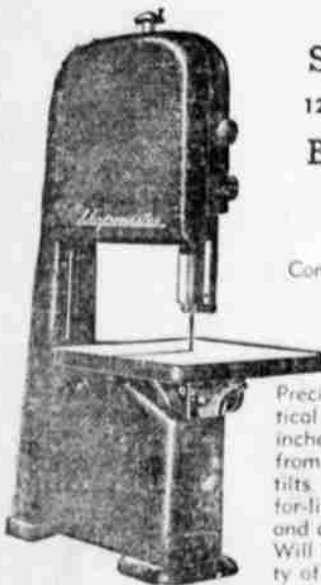

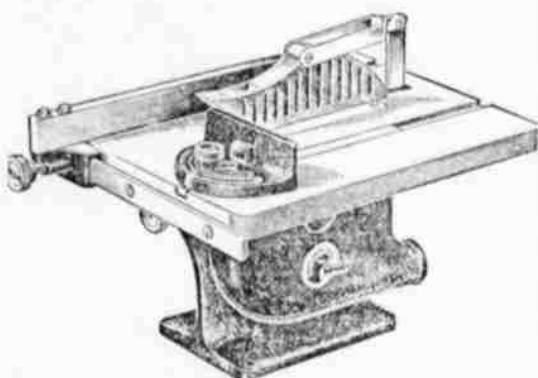
