

Western Oregon Livestock Men To Meet in Roseburg

Pasture conditions and management in Australia and New Zealand, where this type of livestock feed is produced in great abundance, will be reported on by Wallace Kaddery, farm program director for radio KGW, at the annual meeting of the Western Oregon Livestock association in Roseburg February 13 and 14.

Kaddery is listed as principal banquet speaker for the session, announces H. A. Lindgren, secretary, and livestock specialist in the O.S.C. extension service. He has recently returned from "down under" where he traveled widely while visiting at the invitations of the two governments.

Meeting place for the two-day convention will be in the Knights of Pythias hall, while convention headquarters will be in the Umpqua hotel.

Other speakers to appear on the program include R. L. Clark, Portland, livestock commission

firm head, who will speak on the future outlook for meats. James Coon, manager of the Western Wool Warehouse and Storage company, Portland, will discuss the international wool situation. G. H. Hansen, Fish and Wildlife Service, Portland, will speak on predatory animal control.

Oregon State college speakers on the program include P. M. Brandt, head, division of animal industries, and Dr. J. N. Shaw, head of the department of veterinary medicine.

An important feature of the meeting will be the reports and recommendations of committees. The committees and chairmen of each are: disease control, R. L. Jones, Clifton; predatory animal control, Jack Swanson, Lebanon; transportation and marketing, Gene McKinzie, Coburg; general resolutions, E. A. McDonald, Yoncalla; legislation, Al Powers, Coos Bay and range and pasture improvement, Hubert F. Willoughby, Harrisburg.

Membership in the association includes livestock men from 12 western Oregon counties. Albert Julian, Lyons, is president.

Idle by closing down of plants and factories to conserve fuel. However, in Detroit area alone an estimated 200,000 workers were made temporarily jobless when the Michigan Consolidated Gas company suspended all gas supplies to industrial users. The order, to be in effect until next Tuesday, virtually halted auto production in the motor city.

Continued cold weather also was responsible for idling 15,000 workers in the Pittsburgh district following an almost 100 per cent curtailment of industrial gas supplies. In Buffalo, N. Y., a shortage of gas prompted the American Brass Co. to put 400 of its 800 employees on a four-hour shift. Another Buffalo Company temporarily laid off 600 of its 1,200 employees.

There was promise of some relief from the bitter cold which has gripped the Midwest this week and temperatures started to moderate last night in North Dakota. But the mercury was far below zero in many sections of the central states this morning, with a low of -20 at Atlantic, Ia. The sub-zero line extended into Northern Illinois, where Chicago's early morning minimum was -4.

Nurse Trainees Sought by Govt.

Applications for student nurse training at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Washington, D. C., and for adjudicator positions with the Veterans Administration are being accepted by the U. S. Civil Service Commission, M. C. Doyle, local secretary for the commission, reported.

Applicants for the nurses' training must be between the ages of 17 and 35 years and have been graduated from an accredited four-year high school. Senior students who expect to complete the required course not later than Aug. 30, 1948, may apply. St. Elizabeth's is one of the nation's outstanding psychiatric hospitals.

To qualify for adjudicator positions, applicants must have had general experience in legal or quasi-legal activities in government, business, or industry. Special experience must have been in the examination or adjudication of claims arising under law, contract, or government order.

manship he has held since Feb. 1, 1936.

The other two members of the committee were not available for comment.

McCabe is a Republican industrialist who has been chairman of the Philadelphia Federal Reserve Bank since 1939.

Actually, the Senate will vote merely to confirm him as a member of the Reserve system's Board of Governors. The choice of the chairman is up to the president. He announced yesterday that McCabe is the man if the Senate confirms the appointment.

Senator Taft, chairman of the Senate Republican policy committee, told a reporter it was "an extraordinary thing" for Mr. Truman to demote Eccles. But Taft added the President "certainly has every right to do so."

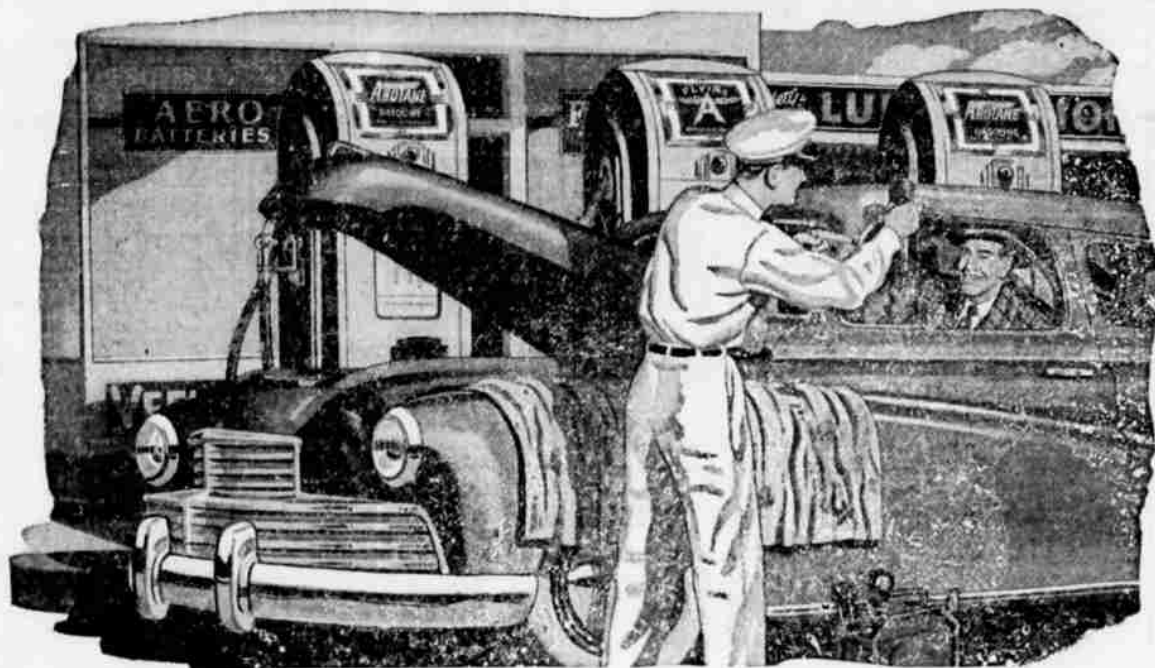
