

Price Controls, Rationing Hit By Dairy Co-Op Head

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31.—(AP)—A spokesman for dairy farmers declared Friday demands for new price controls and rationing come from wrong thinking and "hysteria."

Charles W. Holman, secretary of the National Cooperative Milk Producers Federation, said what this country should ration is exports.

He told the Senate Banking Committee the government should set aside "minimum quantities of essential materials and commodities" for home use before permitting any shipments abroad.

"Such a program," he said, "would assure the people that reasonable supplies for domestic use will be maintained in this country and would put an end to the incentive to bid up prices and build up inventories."

One of the principal arguments for price control, Holman asserted,

is that it would head off another round of wage demands this spring.

"We believe the die is cast and no possible price action can compel or forestall such increases," he said.

"Labor unions take advantage of every opportunity to raise wage scales and otherwise to exploit every opportunity to build springboards for improving their position regardless of productivity."

Holman said the 83 cooperatives which compose the federation have more than 430,000 members.

The committee is studying a proposal to give President Truman power to control wages and prices and order rationing if necessary.

Meanwhile a banking subcommittee called hearings on a bill by Senator Flanders (R-Vt.) to let the agriculture department get set for meat rationing.

The Flanders bill would authorize the department to print ration books, but the program would have to wait for a go-ahead from Congress.

British Facing Bitter Feeling In Arab States

LONDON, Jan. 31.—(AP)—British government worriedly eyed the Middle East today, fearful of a crisis in its relations with the Arab states.

Officials conceded that recent riots in Baghdad reflected a serious British miscalculation of popular Arab opinion. The riots were in protest against a revised British-Iraqi treaty of alliance.

Some informants said the British may try to retrieve lost ground by proposing a slight modification of the treaty, which was signed Jan. 15. It has not been ratified. The government of Premier Salih Bey El Jabur, which negotiated the revision, quit Tuesday.

The treaty would permit British troops to enter Iraq in event of war and would allow the British use of Iraqi airfields.

There was some hope that a new Iraq government might be formed which would be able to convince the people that the treaty is in their best interests.

Foreign Secretary Bevin had expressed hope the British-Iraqi treaty would be one of a system of alliances to form a British Arab bulwark against the spread of Communism in the Middle East.

But the trigger-quick trigger of the Arabian man-on-the-street provides a touchy problem.

Communism Preferred

An illustration of Arab nationalism was given in London yesterday by an unidentified Trans-Jordan official. He said:

"If the people of the middle east had to choose between being Arabs under Communism and being subjects of a foreign imperialism, whether British or American imperialism, unquestioningly they would select Communism."

A Moscow radio commentator heard in London gave the Soviet reaction to the Iraq question. The broadcast said the Arabs regard the treaty as a direct menace to national interests and an attempt "of the imperialists to continue their old colonial policy of enslavement of the peoples of Asia and Africa."

In Baghdad, former Premier Jabur was reliably reported to have fled the city. Crowds marched through Baghdad, crying for his head.

BAGHDAD, Iraq, Jan. 31.—(AP)—Mohamed El Sadr, former president of the Senate, announced today the formation of a new Iraqi cabinet.

Crowds in front of the government building cheered the announcement and shouted for the death of former Premier Al Jabur. Jabur, negotiator of a treaty with Britain which touched off bloody riots in Iraq, is reported to have fled Baghdad.

The new premier is known to be a strong opponent of former Premier El Sadr, who now is under attack for his pro-British leanings.

Breeding Period Change Ups Cow's Milk Output

TRENTON, N. J.—(AP)—The sex life of the cow must be changed, assemblyman Amos F. Dixon, engineer-farmer of Stillwater, says. He has turned the normal biological cycle of his own herd topsy-turvy.

It's all right for western cows to breed in July and drop their calves the following April. He told a farmers' week meeting of dairy groups. But the normal thing plays hob with milk production in the northeast, causing severe shortages in the winter and equally critical surpluses in the spring and summer, Dixon argued.

He said he experimented with his 50-cow herd so that they yielded 47,760 pounds of milk last month compared to 28,000 pounds in December, 1946, and that he will get 44,800 pounds this month as against 26,900 pounds last January.

"My program is simple," Dixon said as he called upon the New Jersey experiment station and other dairymen to revolutionize the milk business. "breed no cows from April 30 to Nov. 1."

U. S. Warships In Italian Ports Hit By Soviet Protest

LONDON, Jan. 30.—(AP)—The Moscow radio said today that Russia has formally charged the United States with violating the Italian Peace Treaty by sending U. S. Warships to Italian ports.

The broadcast said Alexander S. Panyushkin, the Soviet Ambassador in Washington, had sent a protest note to Secretary of State Marshall.

The radio said the Soviets also sent the note to the French Government "with a request to make its contents known to the allied and associated powers which had signed the peace treaty with Italy."

It was the second such protest this week. Yesterday Russia complained to the U. S. and Britain over the proposed reopening of Mellaha air base in North Africa. This protest also charged violation of the Italian treaty.

The broadcast said Russia contended American Warships are visiting Italian ports to support the government of Premier De Gasperi. The government has been under fire from Italian communists for some time.

The announcer said the visits constituted a breach of treaty, which provided for withdrawal from Italy by Dec. 15, 1947, of all armed forces of the allied powers.

(The treaty says "all armed

forces of the allied and associated powers shall be withdrawn from Italy X X X not later than 90 days from the coming into force of the present treaty."

The pact went into effect Sept. 15.)

The U. S. Carrier Midway, three cruisers and 10 destroyers have anchored off some Italian ports, including Naples and Tarento. They constitute part of the Mediterranean fleet.
