Timber Severance Tax

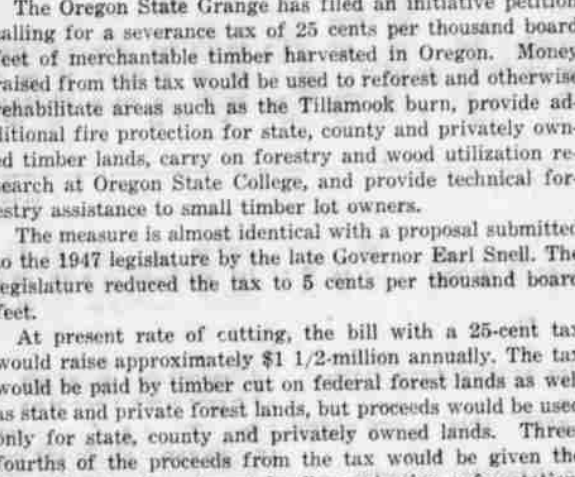

The Oregon State Grange has filed an initiative petition calling for a severance tax of 25 cents per thousand board feet of merchantable timber harvested in Oregon. Money raised from this tax would be used to reforest and otherwise rehabilitate areas such as the Tillamook burn, provide additional fire protection for state, county and privately owned timber lands, carry on forestry and wood utilization research at Oregon State College, and provide technical forestry assistance to small timber lot owners.

At present rate of cutting, the bill with a 25-cent tax would raise approximately \$1 1/2-million annually. The tax would be paid by timber cut on federal forest lands as well as state and private forest lands, but proceeds would be used only for state, county and privately owned lands.
