Co-Op Units For Timber Yields To Be Assailed Here

Determined to press their charges that the pattern on which the federal government is setting up cooperative units for sustained timber yield in the western states is unfair and monopolistic, the Western Forest Industries Association has called a series of public meetings in Western Oregon for next week.

The second meeting of the series will be held at Roseburg on Tuesday Feb. 10 in the Circuit Court room in the county courthouse beginning at 7:30 p.m.

R. T. Titus, executive secretary of the association, said today that an effort was being made to obtain Judge Leif Erickson of Montana as a keynote speaker. Erickson, a figure of nationwide importance, has been very active in opposing a proposed cooperative forest unit in his home state, Titus said.

"The recent public hearing in Eugene on a contemplated unit near that Willamette Valley center," Titus said, "brought out a great deal of opposition—not by the principle of sustained yield, but to the method of setting up the cooperative units."

He said small sawmill operators, loggers and others identified with the industry had flooded the association with denunciations of alleged monopolistic characteristics of the proposed agreements since the facts had been aired at the hearing.

The Roseburg meeting, as will the others scheduled, will be open to the public and business men, mill workers and loggers, and citizens generally are being urged to attend.

A meeting will be held at Drain on Wednesday evening in the community hall. Other meetings are to be held at Albany on Monday, Brownsville on Thursday, and Eugene on Friday.

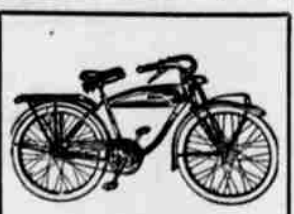
County, City Heads Get Banquet Bid

Britain Dates Take-Over Of Electric Utilities

LONDON, Feb. 6.—(P)—Hugh Gaitskell announced today the government will take ownership of Britain's electric utilities April 1. Gaitskell, minister of fuel and power, made the announcement in the House of Commons.

Legislation nationalizing the nation's entire generating and distribution system was passed by parliament last year. "A very appropriate date," cracked a conservative M. P. on the choice of April 1.

The cost to the government for the 190 private and 370 municipal plants is estimated in the net book of £350,000,000 \$1,400,000,000.
