National Forest Timber for Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:00 P. M. March 8, 1948, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting, and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 12 acres within Section 6, T. 32 S., R. 3 W., W.M., Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 400,000 feet B.M., more or less, of Douglas-fir, and an unestimated amount of other species of saw timber. No bid of less than \$9.60 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$11.30 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$15.30 per M feet for sugar pine, \$3.80 per M feet for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.10 per M feet B.M. to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, a cooperative deposit of \$0.70 per M feet B.M. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$2,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Tiller, Oregon.
