Produced by Dr. Irwin A. Moon, director of the Moody Institute of Science in Los Angeles, the film features actual shots of the Nagasaki and Bikini explosions, as well as the only full-color moving pictures ever taken of the 184-inch cyclotron at the University of California.

"God of the Atom" is second in a series of religious-scientific films produced in the laboratories of the Moody Institute. The film will be shown locally by J. Roy Swanson, Moody representative.
