POOL COMPROMISE

Proposals that Roseburg's projected municipal swimming pool be located in Laurelwood park will, we expect, stir up a hornet's nest of opposition. We know that if we had a home in Laurelwood we would battle the issue through the Supreme Court, if necessary.

Many people doubtless sincerely endorse the Laurelwood site. Undoubtedly a municipal pool could not be located in more beautiful surroundings. The proposed site is owned by the city and, therefore, has the advantage of eliminating cost of purchasing property.

Quietude was rudely shattered when the School District purchased an immediately adjacent tract and constructed the Senior High School and Fullerton Grade School buildings. To place a public swimming pool in the near center of the residential area would finish wrecking the qualities which influenced Laurelwoodians in selecting locations for their homes.

Laurelwood's streets are too narrow to accommodate conveniently the parking of motor vehicles incidental to operation of a pool. In addition to the noise, which always results when many children are brought together at play, residents would have youngsters continually racing across fine lawns, strewing candy bar wrappers and other debris throughout the district.

Both the advantages and disadvantages of the Laurelwood site should be carefully weighed before reaching a decision. We would like to offer a suggestion which might serve as a compromise.

Why not sell the Laurelwood park for homesites and turn the money into the swimming pool fund? The city should be able to realize between \$40,000 and \$50,000 from sale of the property, and that amount of money would, with only minor additions, be sufficient to complete the project, even though it might be necessary to acquire another site through purchase.

Laurelwood park consists of nine irregularly shaped building lots. Most of these lots have in excess of 100-foot frontage and average about 92 feet in depth. They are exceptionally well located for building purposes and would command premium prices.

2 More Arrested In Narcotics Case

EVERETT, Wash., Feb. 11.—(AP)—Federal Narcotics Bureau Agents Joseph Goode and Henry Cardeno arrested Leonard A. Douglas, 24, Route 2, Snohomish, Monday and booked him at the county jail on a charge of conspiracy to violate the internal revenue code.

He was taken into custody at Aldercrest Sanatorium where he had been sent following suspension of a 20-year sentence on a second degree burglary charge.

Undersheriff Jess Jackson said that a jail inmate, Ralph R. McCartney, 34, Klamath Falls, Ore., had also been ordered held by federal agents on a similar charge. McCartney has been awaiting trial for grand larceny.

Douglas admitted during his trial he broke into a drug store here last Dec. 24 and stole narcotics, the undersheriff reported.

Both Douglas and McCartney were clients of Allyn Garfield C. Barnett, 34-year-old Republican candidate for Snohomish County prosecutor at the last election, who was arrested here Saturday night. Barnett was charged with selling narcotics in violation of the internal revenue code. He was arrested in connection with what was to have been a \$6,000 deal, District Supervisor A. B. Crisler said at Seattle.

Red Sympathizers On U. S. Payroll, Report Declares

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—(AP)—Rep. Stefan (D-Neb.) said yesterday a House appropriations subcommittee has received from an investigator a report that more than 100 "Communist sympathizers" are on the state department payroll. No action has been taken on the report, he said.

Stefan is chairman of the subcommittee which handles funds for the state department. "Somebody has leaked," Stefan said when told that parts of the report have been published. "We do not know just what is in the report because we have taken no action on it. We may never make it public. I cannot say whose names are on the list of alleged communists or whether they are communists or sympathizers."

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—(AP)—The national commander of AMVETS recommended yesterday that Congress require American communists to register as foreign agents. He said they also should be barred from running for public office.

Edgar C. Corry, Jr., of Des Moines, Iowa, told a House un-American Activities Subcommittee: "Our personal safety and the security of our nation demand that all communists within our borders be rendered politically and economically impotent."

The city has on hand approximately \$48,000 in the swimming pool fund. City Manager Slankard estimates that a pool can be built in accordance with plans now under consideration for about \$90,000. The proposal has been to use what money is on hand to construct the pool as far as financing permits and then await more funds to complete the job.

It should be taken into consideration that the estimate is based on the presumption that much material and some labor will be obtained through donation, or, at least, at actual cost. Undoubtedly when the time comes to start construction, additional public contributions can be obtained.

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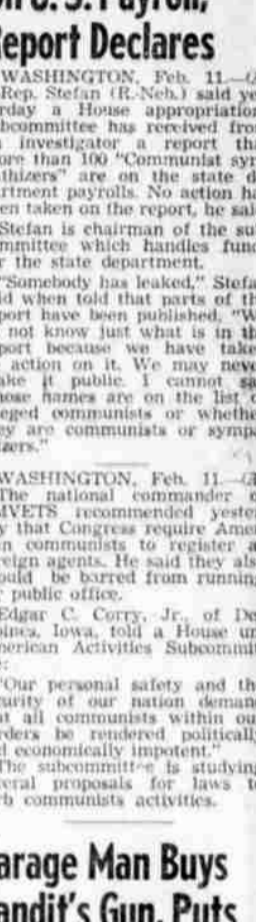
