Wolcott said a two weeks' ban on discussion of other proposals would "let us see where the economy is headed."

"We cannot legislate on economic questions until we know what is happening," he continued. "If this (price decline) goes too far we may have to give our thought to supporting markets."

Standby Prewar Wanted

But Mr. Truman responded with a positive yes when a reporter at his news conference yesterday asked him whether the major economic problem facing the country is still inflation, and not deflation.

Furthermore, the chief executive said flatly that the market break has not lessened the need for the economic program he outlined to Congress November 17.

Among other things, he asked them for standby power to restore price-wage controls and rationing on a limited basis.

"The wounded marine, Private First Class Brayton, died in a field hospital of the Peoples Liberation Army. The captured American marines included a corporal (named by the Navy as Cpl. William L. Pollard, Fort Worth), Privates Dickerson (PFC Carroll W. Dickerson, Olathe, Kan.), Hart (Pvt. Robert Hart, Pittsburg), and another private (PFC Thomas Kapodistria, Buffalo, N. Y.).

"They all serve in the headquarters of the West Pacific American Fleet.

"The military headquarters of the East Shantung Peoples Liberation Army has lodged a strong protest with the American Navy in China, demanding that it apologize and guarantee no recurrence of such actions; otherwise the American troops and the United States government will bear the full responsibility for the consequences resulting from such actions."

Cripps reiterated the appeal for voluntary measures to stem wage and profit rises. Then he asked the House:

"Can we take them in a democratic way by free choice, or are we to demand the imposition of them by force?"

"Unless we exercise restraint," he said, "the sheer facts of the case will demand compulsion, which this government is anxious to avoid."

Cripps asked that wage negotiations either be postponed or conducted in the light of the principles laid down in the white paper—that is, no boosts.

**MOSCOW, Feb. 13 (AP)—**Pravda told the Russians today that the British flag is being taken down all over the British zone of Germany and the Stars and Stripes raised instead, as Americans "take over" the Ruhr and other British-administered areas.

A Munich dispatch printed in the Communist paper asserted the United States is continually buying into Ruhr mines and German factories and otherwise assuring itself permanent footholds in the German economy. The Americans are turning back industrial firms to former Nazis, Pravda said. It depicted the U. S. program of reparations as directed toward removing from the scene all competitors of American firms, leaving untouched the total German war potential.

The United States produces about three-fourths of the cow hides used by the U. S. leather industry.

21 in this country next November. At the time of the 1940 presidential election there were 83,966,629 persons of voting age. Only 49,815,312 of those voted.

Dewey charged in his first major foreign-policy address that the Truman administration is helping the Soviet scheme of world conquest through "blundering" and "compromising" with Russia.

"These are the policies," he said, "which resulted in surrendering 200 million people in middle Europe into the clutches of Soviet Russia and are rapidly delivering the 400 million people of China into the same hands."
