High score for the evening's pinocchle play was won by Mrs. Ed Radigan with Mrs. Welker receiving the low score.

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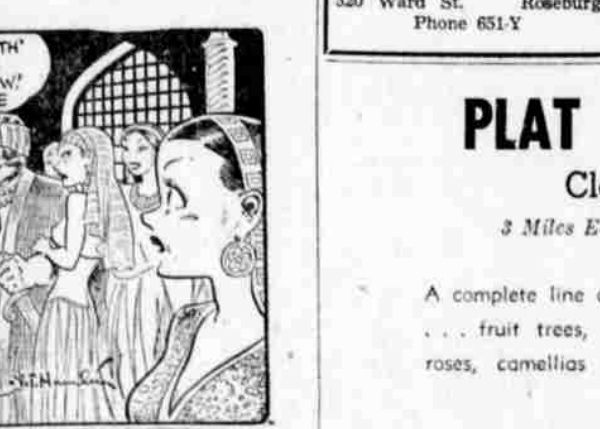
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
