Oregon State Five Defeats Vandals

CORVALLIS, ORE., Feb. 18.—(AP)—Oregon State's Beavers, early leaders of the Northern Division Pacific Coast Conference basketball race, were back within striking distance of the top spot after defeating Idaho's Vandals 58-44 here last night.

The sweep of the two-game series with the Vandals put the Beavers in undisputed possession of second place—only half a game behind league-leading Washington State College. The same margin separates Oregon State from third-place Washington.

Oregon state was in command throughout the game except for one scoring burst that Idaho failed to sustain in the second period.

The Beavers quickly took a 11-5 edge and had a 28-20 halftime margin. They doubled the margin by pushing the count to 36-20 as the second half opened with eight quick points before Idaho could score.

Idaho made its bid at 37-23 when Brimhall and Christensen paired to connect with five long shots. The Vandals cut the margin to eight points, but Samuel came back with four straight field goals for the Beavers to end the threat.

Brimhall was the top scorer with 16 points. Crandall led Oregon State scoring with 13.

VICTORY CLAIMED
Lou Andrus, of Dillard's Andrus and Hult basketball team, claims that the score of the game played between Dillard and Yoncalla Feb. 13 was not 36-35 in favor of Yoncalla, as reported by Yoncalla, but 35-34 in favor of Dillard.

"We win so few games," says Andrus, "that we should get credit for the ones we win."

The score board read 35-34, Dillard, in conference with official Lyle Eddy's decision.

Hager, Dorsetti Will Again Clash For Coast Title

Joe Dorsetti, the tough and tough Italian from New York's Eastside, will attempt to regain the Pacific Coast light-heavyweight wrestling championship at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night in a re-match against Champion Tex Hager. The native Oregonian won the title from Dorsetti here several weeks ago and before the match signed a contract promising Dorsetti a return engagement if the title changed hands.

When Matchmaker Don Owen brought the two principals together in Portland Monday to make final plans, he found that Dorsetti made two demands—that the match be held any place other than Roseburg; that a referee other than Elton Owen officiate the match.

When Owen finished with the conference he announced that Roseburg would be the site for the match, although both Eugene and Salem wanted it, because Hager insisted on that point. He also said that Dorsetti gained one point and that Jack Mitchell, a licensed referee from Portland, would referee the title tilt.

The headline should be a ruged "go". In the last meeting Dorsetti suffered a cut eye and claimed that he was "robbed".

Forecasts are divided on the possible outcome. Some claim that Hager has too much poise for the erstwhile champion and others contend that Dorsetti carried too much dynamite in his fists for Hager. In any case it should be a Donnybrook that will likely pack the Armory to capacity.

Owen said he has booked a preliminary bout that would be a main-event on most programs—Frankie Hart against Buck Weaver. Both the Canadian and the ex-Indiana football star are title contenders.

Fans are urged to make ring-side reservations early in the week.

Heroic Boy Saves Eyesight of Three Hurt in Explosion
Burley, Idaho, Feb. 18.—(AP)—A 12-mile automobile drive by an eight-year-old boy seated on his father's lap is credited with saving the eyesight of three persons temporarily blinded by a gasoline explosion.

Recovering at Cottage Hospital were Louis Graindrod, 37, father of Roy Lee, the second grade

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hero; Kenneth, 13, Roy's brother, Paul Chessly, 25.

The three older persons were drilling a water test well north of here. A gasoline-soaked rag was lighted and dropped to check progress of the drilling Saturday.

The blazing cloth appeared to go out, the Grindrods told a reporter, and gasoline was poured in the hole. An explosion followed.

"My daddy got the worst of it. He was bending over the hole," Roy Lee, who was playing about five feet away, said to a reporter.

"I felt like crying. They could walk but I had to show them where to go."

Hospital attendants said the prompt action of the boy in getting the three injured to medical attention undoubtedly was responsible for saving their sight.

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MUD CLOSES SCHOOLS
MEDICAL LAKE, WASH., Feb. 18.—(AP)—Muddy roads forced closure of all schools in the Medical Lake School District 236 today, superintendent Arthur Irwin said.

The superintendent, who became mired in four inches of mud while driving through the district yesterday, said the schools would remain closed until Monday unless there is a change of conditions.
