SPECIAL TRAINS TO BRING DELEGATES TO NATIONAL CONVENTION

Two special trains to bring delegates to Portland for the annual convention to be held in May, have been planned by the General Federation of Women's Clubs, at its headquarters in Washington, D. C. Both trains will take a full week both coming and returning in order to allow time for the sightseeing trips planned en route. Two day stopovers are included at both Los Angeles and San Francisco, by both trains.

One train will come from New England to Chicago via the New York Central lines. The special will leave Chicago May 18, and come west through Banff and Lake Louise in the Canadian Rockies, and through Vancouver and Seattle, arriving in Portland Sunday, May 23, at 7 A. M. Fol-

lowing the convention, it will return by way of Salt Lake City, Colorado Springs, and St. Louis leaving Portland Sunday, May 30. The second convention train will come the southern route from Chicago through the Grand Canyon, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, arriving in Portland Sunday, May 23, at 1:30 P. M. On its return, it will go north through Seattle, Vancouver, the Canadian Rockies, and Kansas City.

Experienced tour directors will accompany both trains, taking care of hotel reservations, meals, and sightseeing tours, and baggage, tickets, transfers, and other details.

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Communism Won't Win In U. S., Bishop Declares

MORRISTOWN, N. J., Feb. 24.—The Methodist Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam told a Washington Day audience yesterday "Communism will never win in a democratic and just America."

Earlier, Roman Catholic churches had protested that the bishop was "unpatriotic and unqualified to speak on a patriotic occasion."

Magr. John M. Sheerin, of St. Margaret's Roman Catholic Church asked yesterday that no pickets or demonstrators appear outside the meeting hall.

He had contended previously that Bishop Oxnam was an affiliate of organizations being investigated as possible "Communist front groups."

Bishop Oxnam told 300 persons at a luncheon that the United States needs "more faith in democracy and less fear of Communism."

Slides Limit Travel on Two Highways in Douglas
Because of slides on Camas Mountain, there was one-way traffic at two places on the highway between Roseburg and Coos Bay, the State Highway Department reported. There was also one-way traffic on the Pacific Highway three miles north of Drain, where the pavement settled.

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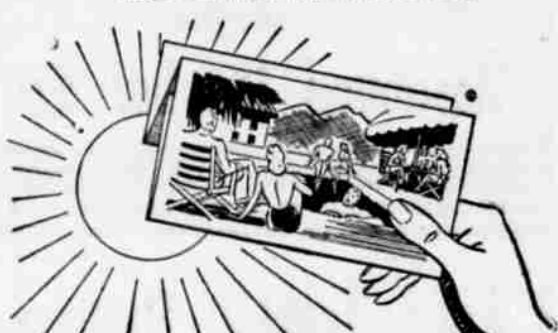
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
