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Steelhead Ban On
Umpqua River Not
Fixed for Salmon

Attention of salmon and steelhead fishermen again is being called by the Game Commission to the closure that will go into effect on coastal streams beginning the first of March.

During March and April the following waters will be closed to angling for salmon and steelhead: All waters directly or indirectly tributary to that part of the Columbia river below the northern city limits of St. Helens; and all waters south of the Columbia river directly or indirectly tributary to the Pacific Ocean, with the exception of the Rogue, Umpqua and Siuslaw rivers which have specific regulations of their own and are listed in the official synopsis of angling regulations which will be available early in March.

The main Rogue River is open the entire year for salmon fishing but steelhead seasons coincide with the special trout seasons set for this stream. On the Umpqua river steelhead fishing will be but this closure does not apply to closed during March and April salmon.

Open the year around to salmon and steelhead fishing are those tributaries of the Columbia river east of St. Helens and waters in eastern Oregon except those for which specific seasons or closures have been provided.

Bag Limit Stated

The bag limit for salmon and steelhead 20 inches and over in length is 2 in the aggregate in any one day but not more than 4 such fish in any 7 consecutive days or in possession at any one time; and not more than 20 such in any one calendar year.

For jack salmon under 20 inches the seasons concur with the salmon seasons. Bag limit for jack salmon is 10 fish in any one day but not more than 20 in possession at any one time. During the summer trout season, the jack salmon must be counted with and as part of the general trout limit.

Five Burn to Death As
Fire Sweeps Home

GLENS FALLS, N. Y., Feb. 25. (AP)—Four children and a housekeeper were burned to death yesterday after a frantic mother had fallen from a porch roof in trying to save them from their flaming home 10 miles west of here.

State police searched the ruins for the bodies of Mrs. Elizabeth Center, 65, the housekeeper, and Janice, 5, Amos, 8, Richard, 6, and Ronald, 4, children of Mrs. Elizabeth Hack, 30.

Mrs. Hack suffered severe burns of the arms, hands, back and face. She was reported in fair condition.

A son by a previous marriage, Vernon Dunkley, 10, escaped without injury, apparently by jumping from the porch roof of the small, one and one-half story frame house.

Hall Wants Tax Surplus
To Work for Oregon

KIAMATH FALLS, Ore., Feb. 25. (AP)—Governor John Hall reiterated advocacy of diversion of income tax surplus funds for use of the state institutions and higher education, at a talk at a joint Chamber of Commerce-Lions Club luncheon here yesterday.

He stated that a \$35,000,000 surplus in the tax funds is in prospect and that he believes in "putting that money to work" for the state, either through legislative action or an initiative measure.

The executive gave no further hint of his political plans except to state in about 10 days whether to seek the Republican nomination for governor.

Morse Replies To
Stassen On T-H
Law Assertion

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25. (AP)—Belief that there is no relation between enactment of the Taft-Hartley labor act and the relatively small number of strikes since its passage was expressed in the senate by Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.).

Criticizing statements he said had been made by Harold E. Stassen GOP hopeful, in Oregon, Morse said that hundreds of union-management contracts have been written in such a way as to avoid the Taft-Hartley ban on the closed shop.

Morse quoted Stassen as saying that the small number of strikes was proof that the Taft-Hartley law is a success.

The Oregon Senator expressed belief that the republicans will win the presidency next November regardless of whom they run, but asked the republican congress to enact anti-lynching, anti-poll tax and "fair employment" laws, and the "many amendments" he said are needed to the labor statute.

Referring to the November elections, Morse said that the Democratic party is in "complete collapse and rout." He said a "great revolt has developed in the (democratic) party over putting into practice the guarantees of the constitution."

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Idaho Vandals Edge
Out Washington in
Final 90 Seconds

MOSCOW, Idaho, Feb. 25. (AP)—The University of Washington had only a mathematical chance today to win the Northern Division Coast Conference basketball title.

The Huskies fell into third place last night as cellar-dwelling Idaho sneaked out an upset 43-41 decision. It was the third win in 14 conference starts for the Vandals, and Washington's sixth loss.

To gain even a tie for the conference crown, Washington must take both its remaining games with Idaho in Seattle, pace-setting Washington State must lose two of its four Oregon road starts and second place Oregon State must lose one of its three remaining games.

Both Idaho and Washington started out in a deliberate style last night with Idaho not making a field goal in the first 11 minutes of play as the score stood 7-5 Washington. Then Brimhall knotted the count with a long-handed push shot. Moments later he hit again and sent Idaho out in front to stay.

The Vandals held a 21-14 half-time lead. White, Taylor and Nichols each hit for Washington counters to narrow the count to 40-39 with 90 seconds remaining in the game, only to have the Idahoans go into the inevitable stall. Geisler's free throw and Christensen's field goal offset a closing mid-floor shot by Opasich, Husky guard.

Brimhall paced the Idaho attack with 17 points, including seven foul shots. Washington's Nichols collected 16 counters.

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Pair Deny Guilt of Fraud
In "Black Sands" Scheme

SPOKANE, Feb. 25. (AP)—Dr. Harold R. Rector, Richland, Wash., and Mrs. Flora L. Carpenter, Spokane, pleaded innocent to conspiracy charges in federal court yesterday.

United States Attorney Erickson has accused them of helping promote a scheme to extract gold from California black sands by "a secret atomic process." Erickson said investors lost \$250,000.

Five other Washington and California defendants were indicted with them on charges of conspiracy, using the mails to defraud and violation of the securities act. They have not been arraigned yet.

Erickson said Rector was described in the group's literature as an "eminent government scientist working on the atom bomb at Hanford." He worked at the atomic bomb project, but Erickson said his job was only to test water.

Land Gift Proposed If
Alaska Becomes State

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25. (AP)—A House committee proposed yesterday to have the federal government give Alaska 22,000,000 acres of land if the territory becomes a state.

The proposal was written into the Alaska statehood bill now being considered by a territories subcommittee. Witnesses told the committee the land involved would be the equivalent of four

sections in each township. Another amendment approved by the committee would give the proposed 49th state revenues from four sections out of each township in the Tongas and Chugach National Forests. The land, however, would remain under direction of the U. S. Forest Service.

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
