DOLLARS VERSUS JOBS

The American public seems unable to contemplate economy in terms of anything other than the dollar. The dollar is, to the public mind, a universal cure-all.

We hear a great deal today about the Marshall Plan. We contemplate the expenditure of billions of dollars for European recovery. But our dollars will go very largely for hand-out relief, whereas European recovery is predicated upon jobs.

We cannot ignore necessity for relief dotes to prevent starvation in Europe. Nor can we expect a full measure of production from a people who have suffered from malnutrition during long years of war and its aftermath.

Labor in this country today is demanding more and more wages. Yet the few dollars acquired by workmen in achieving wage boosts are valueless because the cost of living advances faster than rate of pay and the workman with a larger paycheck than ever before in history, has a harder time supporting his family and maintaining a decent standard of living.

Our interest locally lies in the welfare of the timber industry. This industry, too, is thinking in terms of dollars, not jobs. We are in a period of high profits, so the industry as a whole thinks only of cutting as much profitable timber as possible with no consideration given to waste of resource, permanence of employment, of jobs for the future.

Paradoxically, a slower rate of timber removal would produce more employment, through greater utilization. Because we make dollars through sale of rough, green lumber, we cut only rough green lumber and burn 600 tons of sawdust and refuse daily.

A dollar is worth only what it will buy. A starving man would pay a million dollars, if he had it, for a hamburger sandwich. But we continue to hold the dollar, with its fleeting, vagrant values, before us as a universal panacea.

Gilkey Trading Post Will Handle Improved Engine

Gilkey Trading Post has been named West Coast distributor for the Guiberson Corporation's radial diesel engine, identical to a type used in Army tanks and Navy ships during the recent war.

Because it is lighter, more powerful and less expensive than comparative power plants, the Guiberson engine is expected to near-revolutionize sawmill and similar operations, said Mark Gilkey, manager.

Outstanding characteristics of the engine are that it is portable, being mounted on a light trailer; of aluminum and steel construction and of radial type, with nine cylinders.

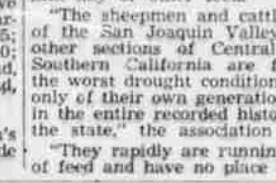

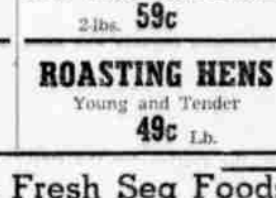
