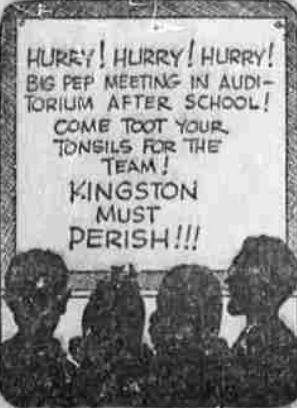
GARDEN VALLEY WOMEN'S CLUB TO MEET THURSDAY

Ferry Tie-Up On Puget Sound May Be Ended Today

SEATTLE, March 2.—(AP)—Possible early restoration of ferry service from Seattle to Port Angeles and Port Townsend cheered northern Olympic peninsula commuters today as they and other "stranded" West Sound residents went into the second day of Puget Sound's paralyzing ferry tie-up.

Capt. Alex M. Peabody, Puget Sound Navigation Company president, said he would make application in Olympia today to operate the luxury ferry Chinook from Seattle to the northern cities. He emphasized, however, that service would be "at rates in excess of those previously in effect."

He made this disclosure after Governor Wallgren announced he would approve resumption of the run.

Other late developments included:

1. Announcement by the state toll bridge authority that it would meet today with commissions of all affected counties to determine the number of vessels needed to restore normal service.

2. Plans to install a Bailey bridge across Agate Pass within 30 days to serve as a temporary span until the state can construct a permanent bridge.

3. Disclosure that one "usable" ferry boat is available for purchase in San Francisco.

Paul Revelle, head of the state's Department of Transportation and member of the toll bridge authority, said the group is exploring the possibility of the state operating a large Puget Sound ferry system.

U. S. Destroyer Ripped by Blast

LONG BEACH, Calif., March 2.—(AP)—The blast-torn destroyer Duncan reached port today with one man dead, 14 injured and a story of valiant crew work to save their ship after an explosion 200 miles at sea.

The 390-foot ship got home under her own power. The starboard side near the stern was rent along the water line, the jagged opening being more than 3 feet long and three or four feet wide. Steel deck plates were buckled.

The injured were transferred to Long Beach Naval Hospital. The name of the man killed will be announced later. Six sailors were injured seriously enough for hospitalization, mostly by burns, but the navy said none was in critical condition.

Cmdr. Paul Van Leunen, Jr., of Cincinnati, O., skipper of the Duncan, which was based at San Diego, told newsmen the explosion was believed caused by acetylene gas from a leaking container. It occurred in the shipfitter's shop, killing the only one man there at the time.

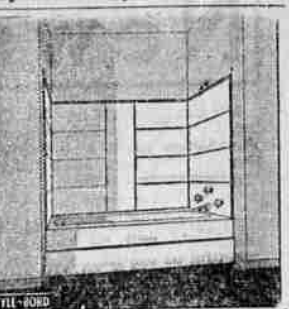
