Vets Hospital Jobs Opened to Exams

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced that examinations for permanent probational appointments to the positions of truck driver, laundryman, and chauffeur are now being given.

Persons interested may file for examinations leading to such appointments at the Roseburg Veterans Hospital.

The entrance salaries for these positions range from \$1,822 to \$2,020 per year. Applicants will be graded on the basis of their experience and training. No written test is required.

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 62, except that

these limits be waived for veterans and under certain conditions for war service indefinite employees.

Application forms and further information may be obtained from the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Veterans Administration Hospital, Roseburg, or from the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners at any first

or second-class post office. Applications must be turned in not later than March 18, 1948.
