

Mat Headliner Tonight Will Be Torrid Battle

A good, old-fashioned knock-down and drag-out feud, a final test of a promising round wrestler, and the debut of a highly-touted newcomer features Matchmaker Don Owen's weekly grappling program at the Roseburg Armory tonight.

The headliner will send Joe Dorsett, Italian villain from New York City, against Sammy Cohen, the Brooklyn "cover boy", in a skirmish that promises to be packed with dynamite from start to finish. Partners in a tag-team match last year, they are among the most hated rivals in the business. Nothing will be barred in the clash except the strangle, low blows, eye-gouging and the finger-jace.

The semi-final features the final test for George Curtis, the popular Mississippi youngster, before gaining main-event billing. He has been sensational of late and will be matched against one

of the best men in the business for the three-fall engagement—Buck Weaver, the Indiana stylist. The show opens at 8:30 p. m. with a one-fall match between Gordon Hessel, newcomer from Santa Fe, New Mexico, and Bob Cummings, the Florida veteran. Elton Owen will referee all three bouts.

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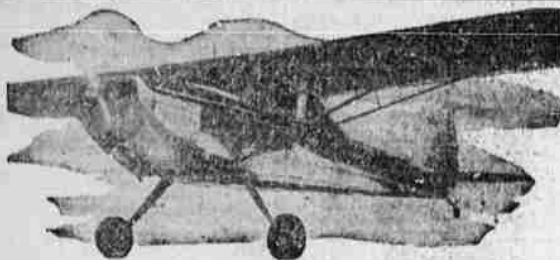
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Coos Bay Pirates Defeat Roseburg Hoopsters, 30-28

The Coos Bay High School Pirates edged out the Roseburg High basketeers, 30-28, last night at Roseburg after holding a comfortable lead through three quarters but letting the Indians narrow the gap in the fourth period. With two minutes left in the game and the Pirates ahead, 29-21, Daryl Black sank a field goal from under the basket which was followed by a key-hole shot by Bob Rogers. A fast break by Chuck Scofield later brought the score to 29-27, in favor of Coos Bay.

Within the last minute Doran Wright of Coos Bay sent the ball through the strings to put the Pirates three points ahead. Rogers made the last point of the game for Roseburg with a conversion. There was comparatively little action during the first stages of the game, with Coos Bay marking up 9 points in the first quarter and the Indians 4. The Pirates chalked up 5 points before Gerry Piper sank the first counter for Roseburg about midway through the first period, after which Scofield connected with a long shot, too. The halftime score was 16-9, Coos Bay. The score at the close of the third was 25-14, Coos Bay leading.

Good teamwork on the part of the Roseburg team was seen throughout the game. In the same teams tonight, the closing contest of the season Roseburg has the opportunity of being the only team to down the undefeated Pirates in league play.

High scorer last night was Coos Bay's Bob Montgomery with 9 points, along with his teammate Don Megale, who fouled out of the game late in the fourth period. Piper, apparently none the worse for his recent absence from the team, due to a sprained ankle, was high-scoring for the Roseburg team with 8—two field goals and four conversions out of 7 tries. A sprained knee is still keeping Chuck Taylor out of action.

The last game between the Indians and the defending state champs will begin tonight at 7:45. Nichols Sparks Huskies To Victory Over Idaho

SEATTLE, March 6. — (AP) — Jack Nichols will be gunning to-night for another Pacific Coast conference all-time basketball scoring record.

He cracked one last night, stuffing 39 points in the hoop as he led the University of Washington to a 77-37 triumph over Idaho. This beat by one point the single game, one-man scoring mark chalked up last year by Oregon State's Red Rocha. Tonight in the season's wind-up game against Idaho, Nichols

needs just 10 points to beat the all-time, 16-game record of 253 points set in 1945 by Vince Hanson of Washington State. Until tonight, Hanson was leading Nichols by 15 points in the current tally race. Nichols has 244 against Hanson's 220 and the latter is through for the year.

Washington needs to win to-night's final game of the season with Idaho to have a chance for at least a tie with Oregon State. For Washington to secure the Oregon would have to beat Oregon State tonight as well.

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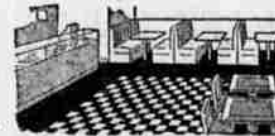
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
