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**Printers in Waukegan
Resign From Union**

WAUKEGAN, Ill., March 10 —(AP)—Thirteen of 20 printers employed by the Waukegan News-Sun, a daily newspaper, resigned yesterday from the AFL-International Typographical Union in protest against the ITU's employer relations policy.

In a letter to R. A. Hawks, president of the ITU's Waukegan Typographical Union, Local 234, the resigning members said "We object to the policy of the officers of the International Typographical Union in their refusal to obey the laws of our nation."

The resignations followed notice by the ITU Executive Council of a special four and one half per cent raise assessment of union members' wages to support printers on strike against newspapers in Chicago and some other cities.

**Income Tax Cuts
Favored by Morse**

WASHINGTON, March 10 —(AP)—Senator Morse (R-Ore.) came out yesterday for reduction of federal income taxes.

"I am convinced that the great majority of my constituents in Oregon and the people of the country want some form of tax relief this year," Morse said. He added he had told Chairman Millikin (R-Colo.) of the Senate finance committee that any tax reduction program should include "some of the sound economic tax recommendations made to the committee on economic development by Paul G. Hoffman, president of the Studebaker Corporation."

These proposals cover amendments to the tax law I offered at the last session of congress and which I shall offer again unless the Millikin report covers at least some of the major ones," Morse continued. He cited as some of the lowering of inheritance tax rates, broadening the tax base and adopting the community property principle on a nationwide basis for income tax purposes.
