Proposed City Budget

City Council after that body has received the budget, Siskind explained.

Parks Outlay Approved—Before the final totals were determined last night, the budget committee approved the employment of a full-time superintendent of parks, at an annual salary of \$3,000, to be in charge of a new city department of parks and playgrounds. An assistant at \$1,000 was also provided.

Also on the new park department's budget was a \$5,000 item previously allowed for the recreational program carried on by the Park Commission, bringing the proposed new department's share of the budget to \$11,475.

Fire Chief's Pay Up—The committee also upped the salary of the fire chief to \$3,780, to make it equal to that of the police chief. A motion by Spencer W. Yates to increase the street

superintendent's salary to a like amount was voted down 6 to 5. At the request of City Councilman Frank Ashley, \$1,500 was allotted for the construction of a garage at the south side of the City Hall for the use of the police department.

The recorder-treasurer's position was allowed \$5,550, an increase of \$1,745 over last year's amount.

Allowance of \$800 for the employment of relief labor at the sewage disposal plant, to provide weekends and holidays off for the present employees, was voted.

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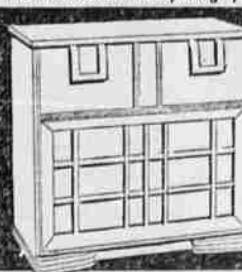
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
