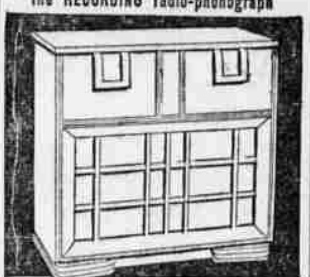
REBEKAH LODGE MEETING IS HELD TUESDAY EVENING
