report to King Gustav that Rits sia's "brusque" methods are alarming. He adds that more money, materials, manpower and industrial capacity are needed to bring Sweden's "coup preparedness" to a higher level.

WHAT does he mean by "brusque methods?" Czechoslovakia knows.

When the crisis came there ARMED MEN APPEARED AT STRATEGIC PLACES in Prague. That was the end of it. Thereafter Czechoslovakia was COMMUNIST.

GENERAL JUNG doesn't want that to happen in Sweden. As a soldier, he knows that only adequate military force can stop it. Hence his advice to King Gustav. In the face of loss of liberty, Western Europe, you see, is beginning to think realistically.

THE next BIG MOVE is expected to come in Italy, where crucial election will occur on April 18. Here is what the communists will aim at in Italy:

They will try to get their hands first on whatever ministry handles the POLICE. The present Italian police system will then be converted into a SECRET POLICE system.

That will clear the way for the appearance of armed men at strategic spots at the psychological moment.

IN Oregon, Leslie Scott with draws as a candidate for the Republican nomination for governor.

He says the cost of making a campaign is somewhere from \$25,000 to \$50,000, and under Oregon law he can spend only \$1500 of his own money. Presumably, he doesn't want to be obligated by spending other people's money to get nominated and elected.
