New-Type Home's Inspection Bidden

A demonstration house, using patented construction style known as "Loxide," has been completed and is now open for public inspection on Mulholland Drive off the Garden Valley road.

The two-bedroom house, 806 square feet in area, has been erected by Briggs and Hugh, Roseburg realtors, exclusive agents in Douglas County for the pre-cut cedar buildings.

The type of construction is new to the West, according to C. S. Briggs of the local firm, and introduces a two-inch cedar wall with a patented interlocking feature which permits erection of walls without nails.

Because of the insulating qualities of the materials, and the strength of construction, Briggs states, the U. S. army has been installing a number of these residences in Alaska. Low construction costs make the buildings particularly suited for local purposes, the agent states.

The public is invited by the agents to inspect the new home, which will be used for demonstration purposes for the next 10 days.

Lyle Ormsbee, representative of the Lions International headquarters at Chicago, was introduced by Elliott and told of the ideals of Lionism.
