

H. F. Orr Rites To Be Held April 2

Funeral services for Hubert Frank Orr, 22, who died at Mercy Hospital Friday after a leg amputation, will be held at Sedro Woolley, Wash., Friday afternoon, April 2, followed by interment there.

Born at Sanish, N. D., Oct. 6, 1925, he served as a seaman 2nd class in the U. S. Navy from May, 1943, to March, 1946. He was married Sept. 15, 1947, to the former Miss Thelma Sawyer at Ephrata, Wash. The couple moved to Sutherlin five years ago from their former home at Concrete, Wash.

Orr was employed here at the Douglas Lumber Co. planing mill, one mile north of Roseburg, where he received leg injuries Friday which resulted in his death.

He was a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Surviving, besides the widow, are Orr's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Orr, Concrete, Wash.; 3 sisters: Mrs. Peter Carter, Coulee City, Wash.; Mrs. Leonard Bacon, St. Louis, Miss.; Mrs. Kenneth Reese, Concrete, and five brothers, Arthur Orr, Raymond Orr, Earl Orr, Richard Orr, and Dennis Orr, all of Concrete.

Funeral arrangements are in charge of the Long & Orr Mortuary.

mentality of war, it is no longer good enough to punish an aggressor after he has begun a war. Preventing war requires buttressing our national security before the crisis is upon us. Never again do we dare permit our own lack of preparedness to encourage any potential aggressor into attacking this country or into overruling other peaceful nations."

Baruch said that although "the time for decision has come, there is no reason for panic or even fright. . . . The resources, economic, military and spiritual, which the free peoples of the world hold, are vastly superior to those which the totalitarians can command."

"We have but to mobilize enough of these resources and to apply them intelligently, vigorously and promptly to achieve the stability in the world which lasting peace requires," he added. It was Baruch who applied the term "cold war" last June to the growing tension between Russia and the western powers.

No Time Being Lost Before Baruch spoke, Chairman Gurney declared that his Armed Services Committee must conclude hearings on the military phases of President Truman's stop-Russia program by the end of the week.

"We simply can't take any more time," Gurney said. "By this week-end, we will have the complete story and all shades of opinion."

Gurney's committee is considering (1) temporary revival of the war-time draft, (2) a permanent program of universal military training and (3) immediate expansion of the peacetime strength of the armed forces at a cost of \$3,448,000,000.

In all some 60 witnesses, most of them UMT foes, have asked to be heard by Gurney's com-

mittee this week.

Among them is Henry A. Wallace, who is seeking the presidency on a third party platform of opposition to most foreign and defense policies of the present administration. He will testify tomorrow.

Opponents Increasing Meanwhile, a hard core of opposition to UMT is gaining recruits in the Senate. A training bill long has been bottled up in the House by that chamber's rules committee.

And now a number of senators, willing to support most of the added billions and expanded manpower for the armed services, are talking on the UMT issue.

Helge Jung, is planning to build and paratroopers in his country.

Saturday, the Moscow government newspaper Izvestia charged the Norwegian government with bases for United States planes planning to lease army bases to the U. S. and Britain.

Red Star and Red Fleet said a war clique is trying to control the Swedish government. The latter said Jung's plan is based on American help and takes in the arming of more soldiers with American weapons and industrial mobilization based on the importing of American strategic materials.

Russia's neighbor, Romania, elected yesterday a national assembly to consider a socialist-communist constitution for the former monarchy.

Partial, unofficial returns show-

ed a 93 per cent vote for the Communist-led government bloc.

Red Press Rants

The Moscow radio said the western powers "intend to destroy and bury the foreign minister's council, just as they are destroying the control council" for Germany.

A dispute over occupation policy has split the western allies from Russia in the control council in Berlin. The four-power foreign ministers' council, which drafts peace treaties, has not met since December, when it broke up in deadlock.

The U. S. member of the foreign ministers' conference—Secretary of State George C. Marshall, went to Bogota, Colombia, for opening of the 21-nation ninth Pan American conference to deal with hemisphere problems.

Senator Pepper (D-Ala.), in a Washington radio interview, urged yesterday that President Truman seek a personal confer-

ence with Stalin in a "last dramatic effort" for peace.

Lie Hurled at Iran

A new Russian note accused the Iranian government of lying about the part played by U. S. military advisers in Iran. The note said an Iranian-American agreement of September, 1947, showed "the role of American military advisers is one of leadership in the Iranian army."

In the Far East, Chinese Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek told an advisory body his worst mistake of the last 10 years was tolerance for the Communists. He said that "resulted in our present civil war." He promised he wouldn't repeat it.

The Burmese government raided Communist headquarters yesterday.
