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F. I. Perry Passes Away in Roseburg

Fred I. Perry, 83, retired railroad machinist, a resident of Roseburg for nearly 60 years, died Tuesday evening at his home, 808 Mill St., following a long illness.

Born Feb. 12, 1865, in Erie County, Pa., he came to Oregon March 17, 1889, and shortly after that date moved to Roseburg where he maintained residence until the time of his death. He was married at Drain, Sept. 10, 1890, to Miss Anna Harlan, who survives.

Mr. Perry was the first person to be accepted into membership through baptism of the First Christian Church of Roseburg following organization of the local congregation in 1892. He remained an active member throughout his lifetime and for a great many years served as an elder, chairman of the church board, and in other positions of responsibility. He was active in campaigns which resulted in construction of the two church buildings the congregation has occupied during the past years.

He also was a life member of the I. O. O. F. lodge.

Surviving are the widow and four sons, Vere H. Perry, State Policeman Fred L. Perry and Vance Perry, all of Roseburg, and C. W. Perry, Myrtle Creek.

He leaves six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren; also a brother, H. O. Perry, Guy Mills, Pa.; a sister, Eunice Reagles, Cambridge Springs, Pa., and a niece, Bernice Elbon, Connecticut, Pa.

Funeral services will be conducted by the Rev. Kenneth Knox at the chapel of the Long & Orr Mortuary at 2 p.m. Friday. Services will be concluded at the I. O. O. F. Cemetery.
