

Free Trip on Navy Craft Offered As Contest Prize

William D. Forhan, U. S. N., in charge of the Navy Recruiting Station in Roseburg, announced today that the Oregon Recruiting Service is starting a state-wide contest for young men between the ages of 1 and 31, the winner of which will receive a free trip on a Navy man-o-war.

The only requirement is that the entrant be a male citizen of the United States residing in Oregon or the southern counties of Washington and within the age limits. The contest is sponsored by the Navy League of Oregon.

The contestant will be required to complete the following sentence on an official contest entry blank: "I believe that the United States Navy offers great opportunity to young men because . . . using 50 words or less."

Either verse or prose will be acceptable and the entries will be judged on originality, accuracy, composition and accuracy. All entries will be judged at the main Navy Recruiting Station in Portland and will become the property of the Navy.

"The recruiting service is positive that the contest should have a wide appeal throughout the state, providing as it does for a fine vacation trip with all expenses paid," Forhan said. "Not only will the winner have an interesting trip on a Navy ship, probably from San Diego or San Pedro to Seattle, but also they will be flown to and from the ship via a plane of the Naval Air Transport Command."

Official contest entry blanks, which must be used and which contain all pertinent instructions for the contest, may be obtained from any Navy recruiting station in Oregon or by writing to Navy, Detachment, 519 Southwest Third Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

The winner's trip will be similar to trips which the Navy has been giving to various business and civic leaders in the United States during the past year. They serve the purpose of acquainting the public with the ways in which the Navy actually operates and the necessity of acquiring the best type of young American manhood to operate the complicated mechanism of a modern man-o-war.

Members of the Navy Recruiting Service or their families are not eligible to enter the contest. In addition, no member or ex-member of the Navy or Naval Reserve is eligible.

It is emphasized that the trip would entail no expense to the government, as the winner would travel via regularly scheduled ship and plane movements.

Early Plowing Best Treatment For Cover Crops

Orchard cover crops will have served their purpose in protecting soil from leaching and erosion by late March or early April, so plow them under as soon as possible, advises Arthur S. King, O. S. C. extension specialist in soils.

When trees start their growth in the spring, growing cover crops compete with the tree for moisture and plant food. At this time of the year, unfertilized cover crops may not present an impressive appearance, King points out, but it is still the best practice to "plow them down" rather than wait for more growth. Then, he suggests, plan to use fertilizer next year to secure more early spring growth.

King says the expression "plow them down" is used, although it is not exactly the correct expression. For orchard work, discs or other implements have almost completely replaced the plow. Regardless of the turning under implement used, the change to the trees will be done if the soil is stirred deeper than three or four inches. It is not necessary to bury the entire cover crop.

Mixing Best Method
In fact, plant growth will add soil fertility more quickly if it is merely mixed with the soil with some of the growth remaining on the surface, King recommends that cover crop discs be equipped with depth gauges to avoid deep cultivation.

Early plowing is also desirable for cover crops on commercial vegetable land, though not a "must" as it is in orchards. If irrigation water is used, the cover crop can be allowed to grow until about three weeks before the vegetable crop is seeded. This extra growth period may permit turning down an increased amount of organic matter.

An application of nitrogen fertilizer will speed the decay of a cover crop which is being turned down. This is especially true for cover crops which are close to maturity, King states.
