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Impressions Of Mexico Topic Of Phil Harth's Talk

"Across the River," in which he described the contrast he experienced in going from the United States across the Rio Grande River into Mexico, was the topic of a 10-minute talk given by Phil Harth local merchant, at the weekly Toastmasters Club dinner meeting Tuesday night in the Umpqua Hotel.

Harth gave a vivid description picturing modern, progressive activity in a town in Texas on the United States side of the river, and the slow life, symbolized by a donkey-drawn wooden cart, in the small town on the Mexico side of the international bridge.

These observations were made by the speaker on a trip to the country of our southern neighbors. He described phases of his trip which took him to the 8000-foot plateau area on which the 2,000,000 population center of Mexico City is located. The city, he said, is made up of the extremely rich few, and the much greater number of extremely poor, who gave him the impression they were beasts of burden. They carried very heavy loads on their backs and heads.

Labor Poorly Paid
Most Mexican labor, he said, is by hand. Girls painted pottery at one factory he visited. At an onyx factory, a man sawed a huge block by hand. Laborers got two pesos, approximately 40 cents a day. A 12-year-old boy, who had been badly burned by molten glass, was sweating in a glass factory for one peso a day.

He said it was hard to picture such a contrast just "across the river," and he deplored those in this country who were trying to overthrow our government and way of living.

Flying Student Talks
Explaining that modern day airplanes have a great many safety devices which reduce causes of accidents, Sam Reed spoke on "Learning to Fly." Reed, who has seven hours in the air, but who flew considerably as a passenger in Army planes while stationed at Hickam Field in the Hawaiian Islands during the war, told of his thrills and sensations experienced during his first flying lessons. He said new training planes practically fly themselves, will take off, come out of spins and stalls and will automatically right themselves in the air. He is looking forward with pleasure to his first solo flight, he said.

Jerome Sheldon spoke of "City Planning" in which he described problems confronting city planning commissions. He said when he thought of planning he had in mind such cities as Washington, D. C., planned before the city was ever laid out. But Roseburg, he said, like so many cities, just grew. He described briefly some of the work of the Roseburg planning commission, a board of eight men, appointed by the mayor to make recommendations to the city council.

Law Library in County Courthouse Redecorated
Redecoration of the law library on the third floor of the County Courthouse is almost complete. The rooms formerly were occupied by the Justice Court. Walls and shelves have been repainted and reference books arranged for use. During the recent war, the Justice Court occupied the law library while the Selective Service Board used the present Justice Court office at the east end of the courthouse. The library may be used by any local attorney.

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Lumber Workers In Pine Industry Given Wage Boost

KLAMATH FALLS, re., April 7.—(AP)—A wage settlement giving thousands of IWA-CIO lumber and sawmill workers in Oregon and northern California pine industry a 12-cent hourly pay by negotiators of the Pine Industrial Relations Committee and International Woodworkers of America.

The 12-cent figure follows the pattern set earlier in Portland as settlement of the lumber industry with fir workers.

Ratification of the union membership and employers is necessary to put the agreement into effect, retroactive to April 1.

Pay scale for IWA lumber workers now will be about \$1.45 an hour. American Federation of Labor union leaders in this area have asked that their contracts with the pine industry be reopened.

The AFL settlement made several weeks ago and effective January 1, was for a 7-cent boost. Piece-workers will also get an increase commensurate with the hourly increase.

The IWA immediately began polling its membership for a vote of acceptance or rejection of the settlement and is to inform the Pine Industrial Relations Committee of the workers' decision by April 27.

The settlement affects workers and the pine industry in the Klamath basin, most of Northern California, Bend, Prineville, Ashland, Medford and other pine centers of the two states.

Violence Attends Truckers' Strike

CARLISLE, Pa., April 6.—(AP)—Violence was reported today in the unique sitdown strike of a small army of angry truck drivers bivouacked in trucks on Pennsylvania's \$70,000,000 "dream" highway.

Major Charles Keller of the state police announced seven of the truck drivers were fined \$28.50 apiece on charges of throwing stones at two trucks whose drivers refused to join the sit-down.

Keller said the stones damaged new automobiles which were being transported on the two trucks.

The sitdowners said the demonstration on the streamlined Pittsburgh-Harrisburg express highway was a protest against a state weight law.

A committee of truck drivers said they would call on state police at Harrisburg again today with a brief outlining their demands.

Albanian Aid To Guerrillas Noted

KASTANIANI, Greece, April 7.—(AP)—United Nations observers watching the southern Albanian border came under fire this week when Greek guerrillas defending Mount Murgana unsuccessfully struck at this frontier village.

Mortar shells and hundreds of machinegun bullets crashed into Kastaniani in a three-hour attack. One Greek soldier was wounded. The firing began after observers from the U. N. special commission on the Balkans had watched the lights of trucks which apparently had brought guerrilla supplies to the border.

Blood found near one Greek army outpost indicated there had been some guerrilla loss.

Battered Kastaniani was recaptured a month ago from the guerrillas. Only 400 yards from the Albanian border, it is one of the key spots from which U. N. observers watch border movements to determine the amount of foreign Communist assistance the guerrillas receive.

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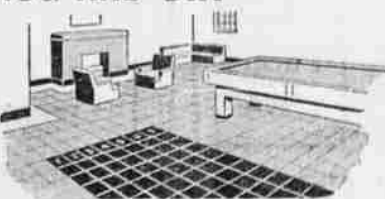
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This parade will take place annually two weeks before the regular rodeo parade. Show dates this year are JUNE 19th and 20th.
