**Retail Trade Assn. Ready for Operation**

represent their wares, (4) championing the cause of retailers in all legislation affecting their interests, local, state or national, (5) protecting members against advertising mediums which have no advertising value, (6) promotion of cooperative delivery, uniform closing hours and holiday agreements, (7) obtaining from organizations in other towns and the issuance to its members of confidential information on check forgers, shoplifters, fake solicitors and all kinds of frauds, (8) exchanging of credit information among members.

**Operating Procedure**  
Membership shall be limited to individual or business concerns who are operating retail merchandise establishments and are members of the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce. No membership shall be entitled to more than one vote, the by-laws state. Dues were set at \$12 yearly, payable semi-annually, to include scheduled luncheon meetings. Officers would include a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, provided, however, that the secretary-manager of the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce shall fill the office of secretary during his tenure of office with the chamber. Six directors will be elected, two for a one-year term, two for a two-year term and two for a three-year term.

with two directors to be elected for a three-year term annually thereafter.

Standing committees of three members each, appointed by the president and approved by the directors, shall be: sanctions, street decorations, publicity, special sales events, and finance.

**Will Eye Solicitors**  
The sanctions committee, which shall promote and regulate among members of the association the agreement that they consider no requests unless the solicitor presents written credentials from its secretary, will be one of prime importance.

To promote a broader and more intelligent charity, and to eliminate unprofitable advertising, the sanction committee is created to pass on all propositions of solicitors and adopt the following rules for guidance of its members. Placing of advertising in newspapers of general circulation and use of billboards, posters, motor bus placards, picture slides and films, shall in no way be affected by this agreement; but solicitors presenting any of the following matters shall be refused unless they present written credentials from the secretary issued under the authority of the sanction committee:

(A) Forms of advertising, not above excepted, including programs, hotel registers, cabinets, menu cards, time books, song books, trading stamps, etc., and requests for donations in cash or goods in lieu of such advertising; (B) donations in cash or goods to churches, lodges, clubs, societies or other organizations; (C) purchase of tickets, except when solicitation by an organization is confined within its own membership. When credentials are presented the member solicited is by no means bound by the approval of the sanction committee, but is free to use his own judgment. The committee is requested to use its best judgment as to matters under headings (B) and (C) above, when issuing credentials for worthy causes when deemed advisable.

The finance committee's duties

shall be to formulate and make effective all plans for the securing of needed finances over and above such funds as are raised through the payment of associations dues and allotted to the association by the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce.
