Farm Labor Shortage Oregon Possibility

PORTLAND—(AP)—A possible farm labor shortage during Oregon's peak harvest season is seen by the State Employment Service.

The agency reported late plantings of some crops would cause these to mature at the time others are ready for marketing. Earl Lovell, OSES director, said 15,000 migrant workers would be needed in addition to the 50,000 normally available from local sources.

The harvest peak is due in early September instead of mid-August the OSES estimated.

Labor Election Date Changed At Fir Mfg. Plant

A union certification election at the Fir Manufacturing Co. in Myrtle Creek, originally scheduled April 13 by the National Labor Relations Board, will probably be held April 22 or 23 after the mill resumes operations from a shutdown caused by a lack of logs.

The election will represent a test between approximately 300 AFL and CIO workers employed at the mill.

Oscar Slack, international representative for the Carpenters and Joiners Union, with which the Lumber and Sawmill Workers, AFL, is affiliated, said the Firco sawmill and plywood plant will be considered as one operation. His union will seek a continuance of the AFL contract which, he said, was written to cover both the sawmill and plywood plant.

Eugene Miller, business agent for Local 7-307, International Woodworkers of America, CIO, said his union will seek representation for the plywood workers, a majority of whom, he contended, are members of the IWA-CIO. He pointed out that both AFL and CIO leaders and the NLRB desire the election to be held when all workers will have returned to their jobs.

Operations are expected to be resumed at Firco April 19. The lack of peeler logs, which caused the shutdown of the company's operations is due to snow and weather conditions which have hampered logging operations in the woods.

14-Year-Old Murderer Given Life Sentence

EVERETT, April 10.—(AP)—Gates of the Washington state penitentiary at Walla Walla open soon for 14-year-old Richard Hagen—sentenced to life imprisonment. The boy listened almost impassively yesterday as Superior Judge Ralph C. Bell pronounced sentence for the first degree murder of James Moore, 69, in his Hartford home last November. The junior high school student was the youngest person ever tried for murder in Snohomish County, and is thought to be the second youngest sentenced to a life term in the state prison.

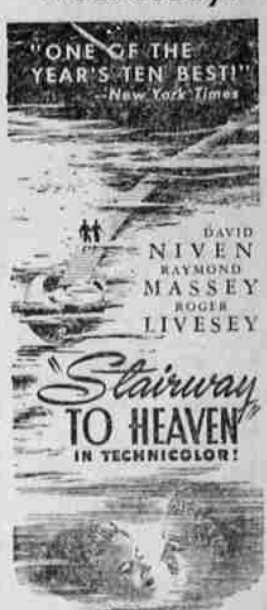
