

## Sactos Rise To 3rd Spot; Padres Defeat Beavers

## Jock Sutherland, Noted Football Coach, Dies

PITTSBURGH, April 12.—(AP)—The nation's sportsmen-athlete and spectator alike today mourned Dr. John B. (Jock) Sutherland, the "Silent Scot" of American college and professional football.

Hundreds of messages of condolence poured into the steel city following the death yesterday of the 59-year-old coach of the National Football League's Pittsburgh Steelers. He died after an operation for a malignant brain tumor.

Sutherland, who achieved his greatest fame at the University of Pittsburgh, was found wandering not far from his mired car last Wednesday near Bandana, Ky.

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## Dusette Defeats Katonen; Phantom Conquers Lynam

Repeated plunging into the ropes to avoid Georges Dusette's paralyzing full-nelson hold failed in the end to avert defeat for Paavo Katonen in the wrestling card headliner at the Armory Saturday night. On the third occasion in the third and final round when the Finn dove into the ropes to break the hold, the enraged Dusette kicked him thru the barrier onto the floor, then jumped down after him, re-applied the nelson clamp and, despite the intervention of Referee Elton Owen, punished the Finn for nearly a half-minute before dropping him limp in front of first row spectators. The fall, posted off the mat, did not count, but it left Paavo too dazed and weak for further effective resistance. When he managed to get back into the ring barely within the 20-second time limit, he quickly fell into another nelson hold, and the battle was over. The round lasted 8 minutes. Katonen nearly won that final count by applying his hangman specialty after head-butting Dusette into the ropes. He failed because Dusette's legs dangled in the ropes, compelling Owen to break the hold.

The hangman hold gave Katonen the first fall of the bout in 13:26, after Dusette was punished with belly punches, head-butts and slams into the ring corners. Owen's offer to award the fall on fouls was waved away by Dusette, who took revenge in the second round by subduing the Finn in 6:40 with a series of headlocks, after the ropes twice rescued Katonen from the nelson hold. Dusette's triumph drew a roar of acclaim from 700 spectators.

A rough and tough melee, with speed and class besides, wearing a hood and billed as "The Phantom," won the supporting bout from Joe Lynam. Like Katonen, the hooded guy included head-butts in his repertoire, but his chief weapon was a figure 4 toe-hold. With this he subdued Joe in two straight falls, the first in 26:18, the second in 8 minutes.

## Claude Harmon Ties Masters' Top In Golf Triumph

AUGUSTA, Ga., April 12.—(AP)—The 12th annual masters' golf tournament is over, but not the memory of dark-horse Claude Harmon's win with a record tying 279.

For Harmon, a club pro who winters at Seminole Club, Palm Beach, Fla., and summers at Winged Foot, Mamaroneck, N. Y., the victory yesterday was worth \$2,500.

His 279 tied the masters' record set by Ralph Guldahl in 1939. The 31-year-old Harmon came in five-strokes ahead of Cary Middlecoff of Memphis, Tenn., who was second in the field of 57 of the world's best golfers.

Harmon's winning score was 36 strokes ahead of the most famous of them all, Bobby Jones, making his annual tournament appearance, registered another 73 Sunday for a 76-hole total of 315, his worst competitive showing.

In third place with 287 was Chick Harbert of Detroit who blew up on the first nine of the final round after starting the day as the chief threat to Harmon.

Bud Ward, Spokane, Wash., shot a 299.

Tied for fourth and matching par of 288 were Lloyd Mangrum of Chicago, the first day's leader, and Jim Ferrier, also of Chicago. The remainder of the field was scattered like birdshot with pre-tournament favorites finding the 6,800-yard, par 72 course too much of a headache.

Defending champion Jimmy Demaret of Ojai, Calif., was down in the 295 bracket.

## Sno-Cats Victors In Cascade Trek

HOOD RIVER, Ore., April 10.—(AP)—The snow-covered Cascade range, already tested this week by a lone skier, now has been conquered by man's machines.

The mechanized snow survey party of seven men and two snow tractors (sno-cats) arrived here yesterday after a 22-day journey the length of the Cascades.

The trip started at Ashland, Arch Work, leader of the group who is in charge of snow surveys in Oregon, estimated the party traveled 573 miles.

It was undertaken to determine whether the tractors could be adapted for snow survey work, now carried out by men on skis. Heavy snows and mechanical trouble delayed the party a week beyond their expected arrival time.

The day previous a skier, Jack Meissner, 28, Cascade Summit, Ore., completed a journey from Mt. Hood to Crater Lake.

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
