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F. F. Parker, Native Of Oakland, Passes

Frank F. Parker, pioneer Douglas County resident, died at his home at Cottage Grove April 13 after a lingering illness. He was born at Oakland Jan. 30, 1875, next oldest of the 12 children of the late Albert and Arminia Parker, pioneer Oregon settlers.

During most of his lifetime, Mr. Parker and his family resided at Wilbur, moving to Cottage Grove in 1943. Before his illness, he had been active in community and civic affairs. He was a life-long member of the Methodist Church and was affiliated with the Odd Fellows Lodge.

Mr. Parker was married June 9, 1900, to Ethel May Spear, surviving widow, who are one son and three daughters: Lawrence Parker, Richmond, Calif.; Mrs. Golda Wickham, Eugene, Ore.; Mrs. Lola Files, Santa Rosa, Calif.; Mrs. Beula Malan, Las Vegas, Nev., and two grandchildren: Miss Kay Goddard, Eugene, and Delwin Parker, Richmond.

Three brothers and three sisters also survive: Ora L. Parker, Wenatchee, Wash.; Clarence E. Parker, Battleground, Wash.; Oliver L. Jones, Cathlamet, Wash.; Mrs. Bessie Smith, Huntington Park, Calif.; Mrs. Mary Hamilton, Sunnyside, Wash., and Mrs. Pearl Williams, Portland.

Funeral services will be held at the Mills Chapel, Cottage Grove, April 15 at 2 p. m. Rev. Frank Brown, First Methodist Church of Cottage Grove, will conduct the rites. Interment will follow in the Wilbur Cemetery.
